

**ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE DEGREE (AAS)**

This degree offers a concentration in law enforcement or criminal forensics that addresses both the legal and professional aspects of the criminal justice network while integrating social and behavioral sciences. The program prepares people seeking employment in the field of law enforcement. The program also provides professional growth and preparation for career promotions to those already employed in the criminal justice field. The department will award a Certificate of Completion for each CRJ Concentration successfully completed by the student.
