**T**hank you for your interest in the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program. This program is a full-time curriculum taken over four semesters that typically consist of three days per week followed by 16 weeks of full-time clinicals at the completion of all coursework. The program is also available on a part-time basis over six semesters. The curriculum prepares students to treat, through purposeful activity or occupation, those who have been disabled by inactivity, disease, workplace accidents, traumatic injuries and those born with a disability. Certified occupational therapy assistants treat clients in hospitals, outpatient centers, rehabilitation centers, hand clinics, community centers, long-term care facilities and mental health facilities. Although CSN is Nevada's largest college, you will still enjoy small class sizes designed for one-on-one attention helping ensure you have the tools to successfully complete this program.
