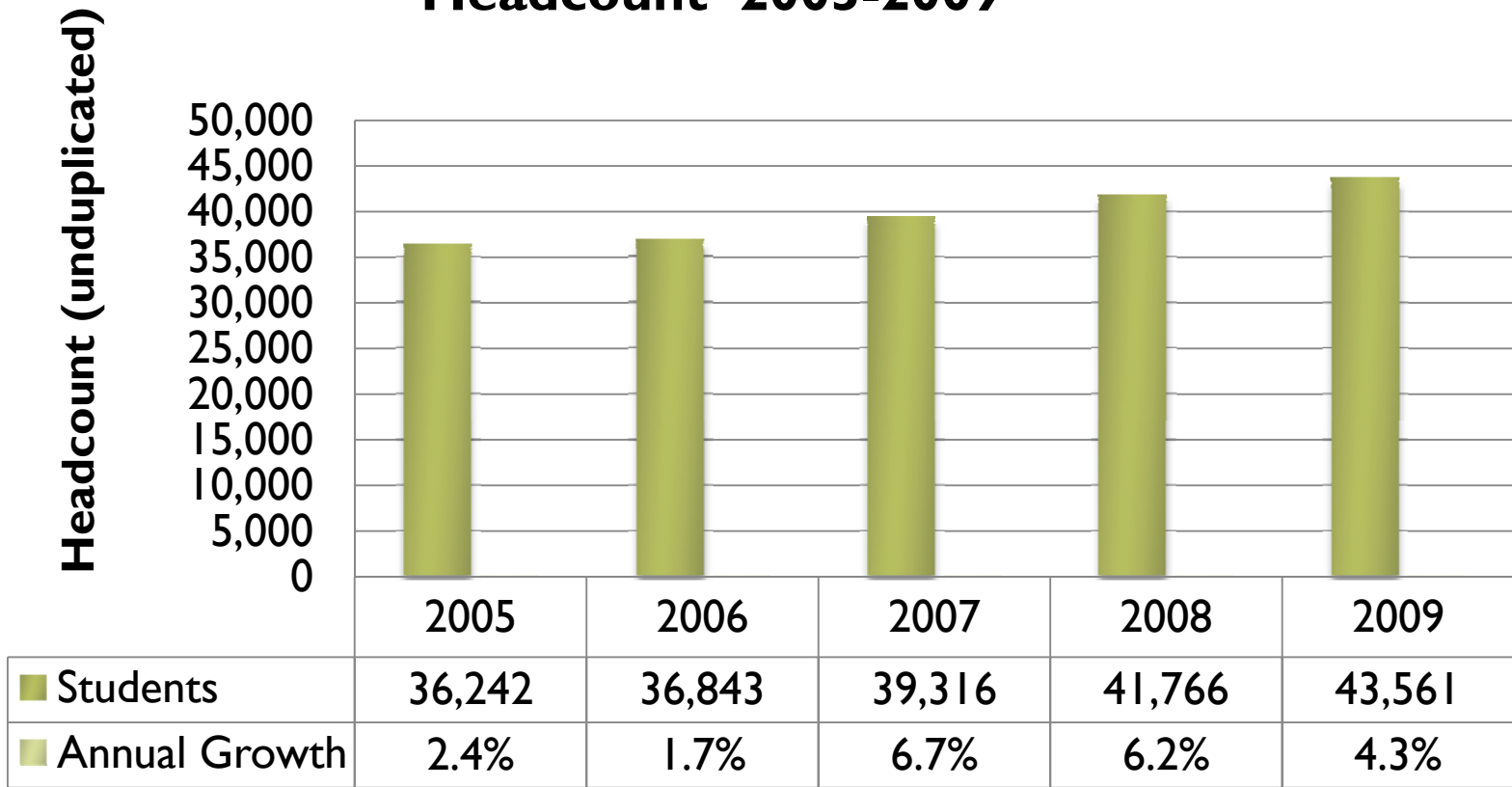

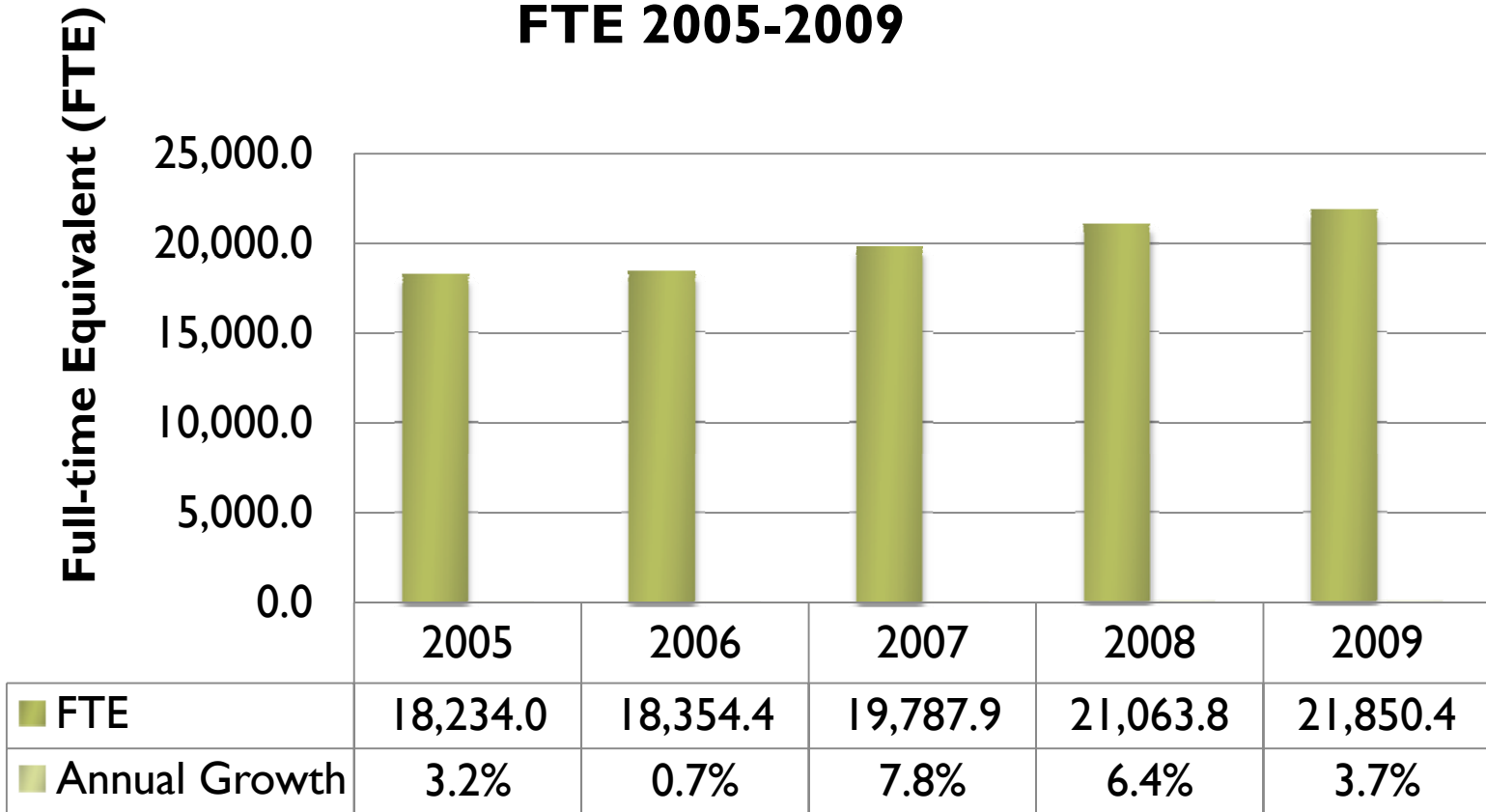
## CSN Fall Enrollment - Headcount 2005-2009

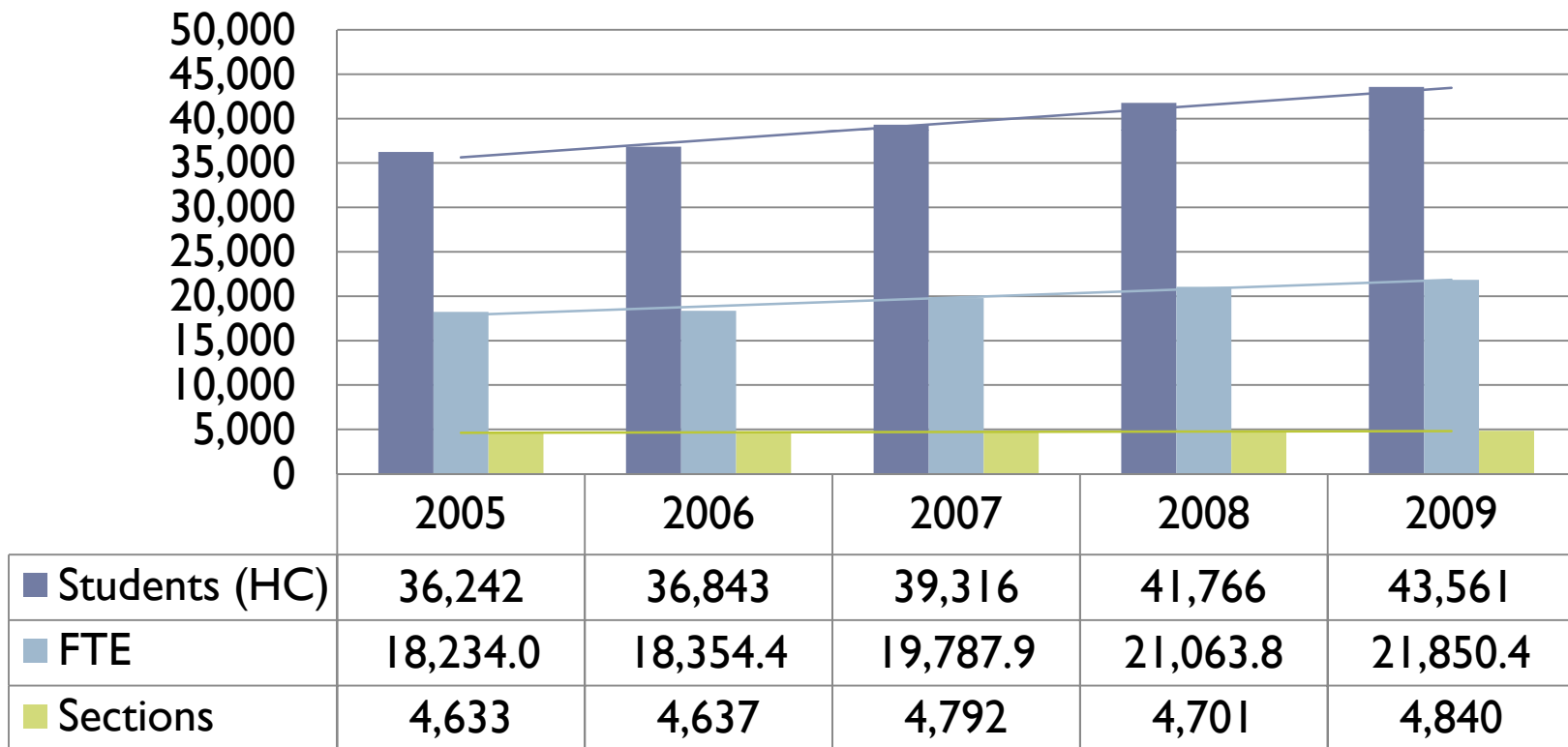
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**CSN Fall Enrollment -

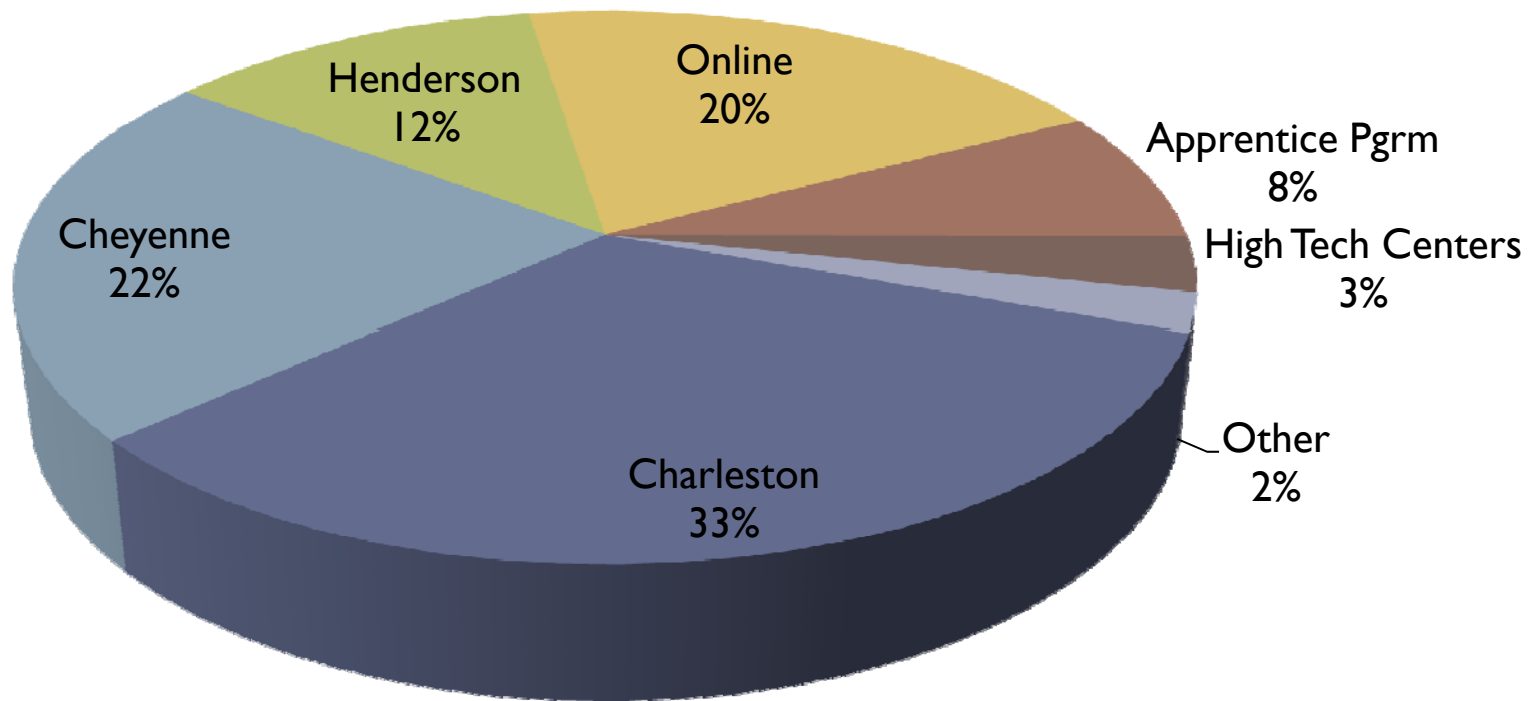

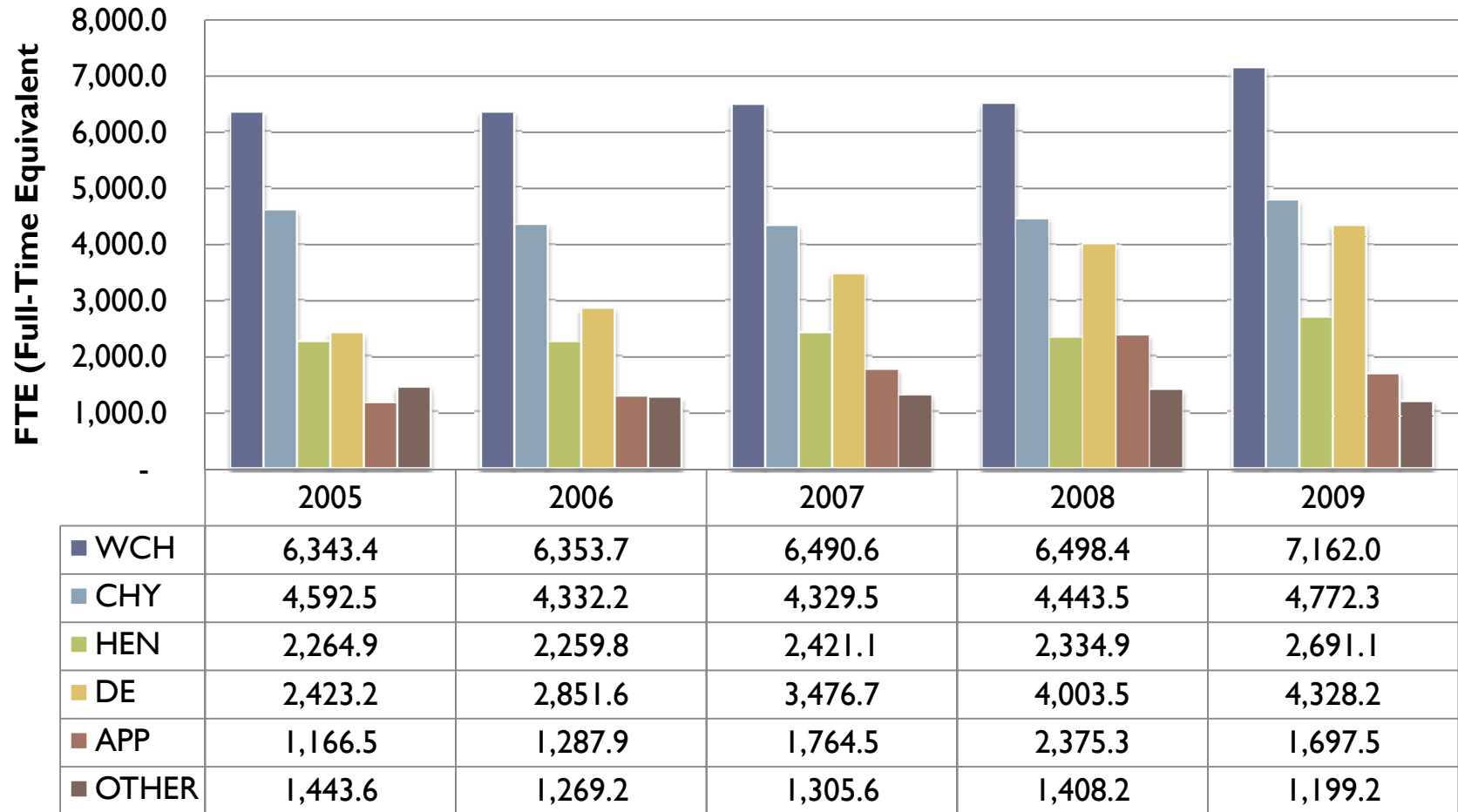

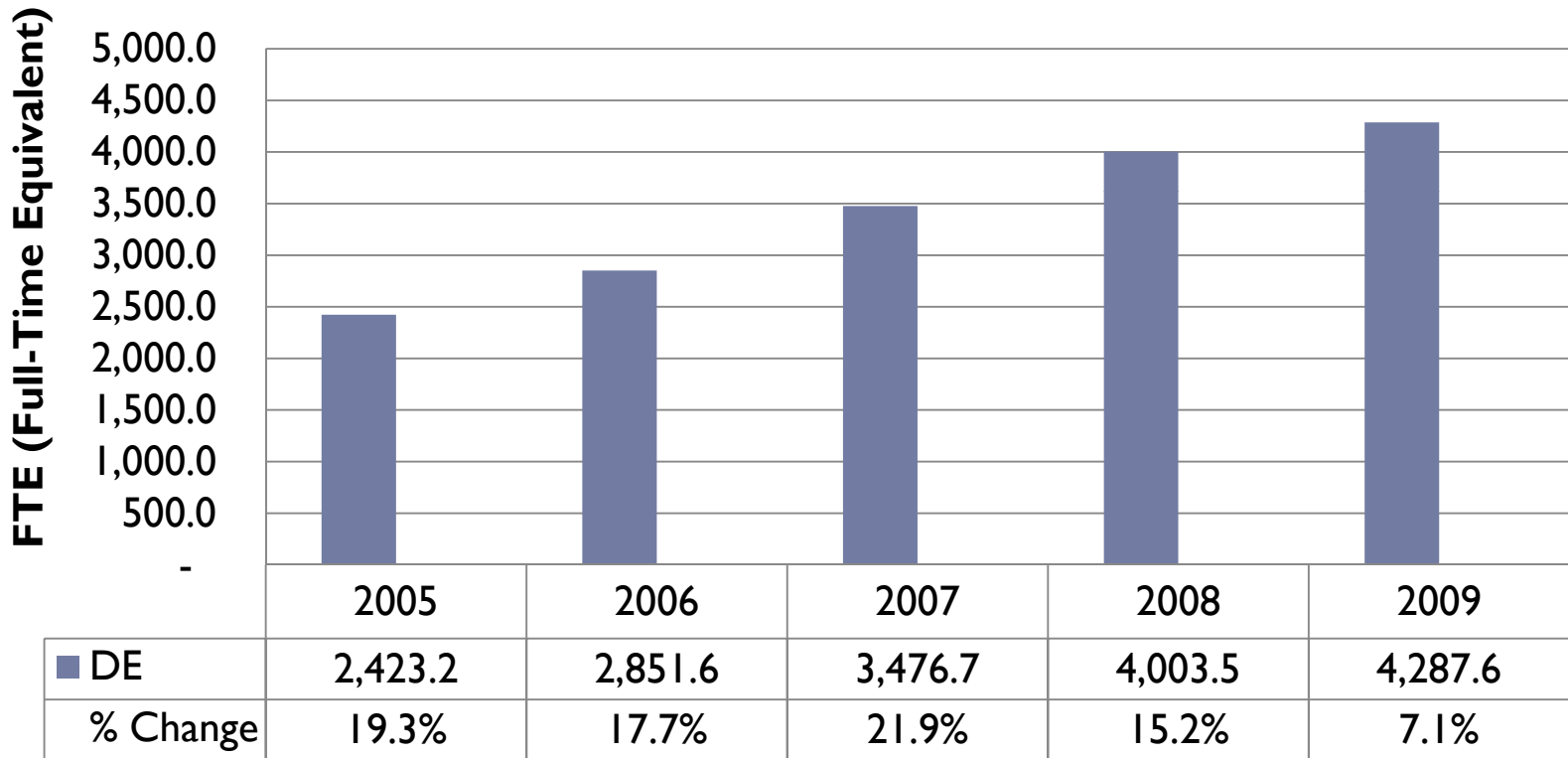

# Collecting Race/Ethnicity Data: Changes after Feb. 2009

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To comply with IPEDS, CSN has changed the way we collect race and ethnicity (R/E) data from students and employees:

- ▶ Respondents must answer two questions.  
#1 asks about Hispanic culture or origin, and #2 asks about racial categories.
- ▶ Respondents can select more than one racial category.

# Reporting Race/Ethnicity Data: Changes after Feb. 2009

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The changes will affect how we report R/E data in the future. We will report ethnicity data in two formats

- ▶ An unduplicated table where **each student is reported one time**. Students who select more than one racial category will be reported only as “Multi-ethnic.” These totals will be the same as the regular unduplicated headcount.
- ▶ A semi-duplicated table for each racial category where **each student is reported one time for each racial category selected**. These totals will be larger than the regular unduplicated headcount.
- ▶ Hispanic data will also be reported.

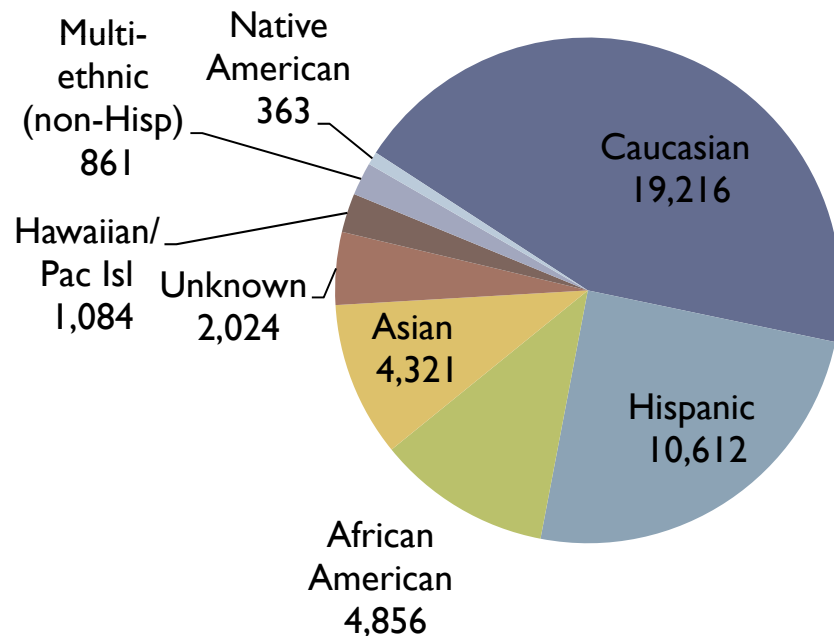

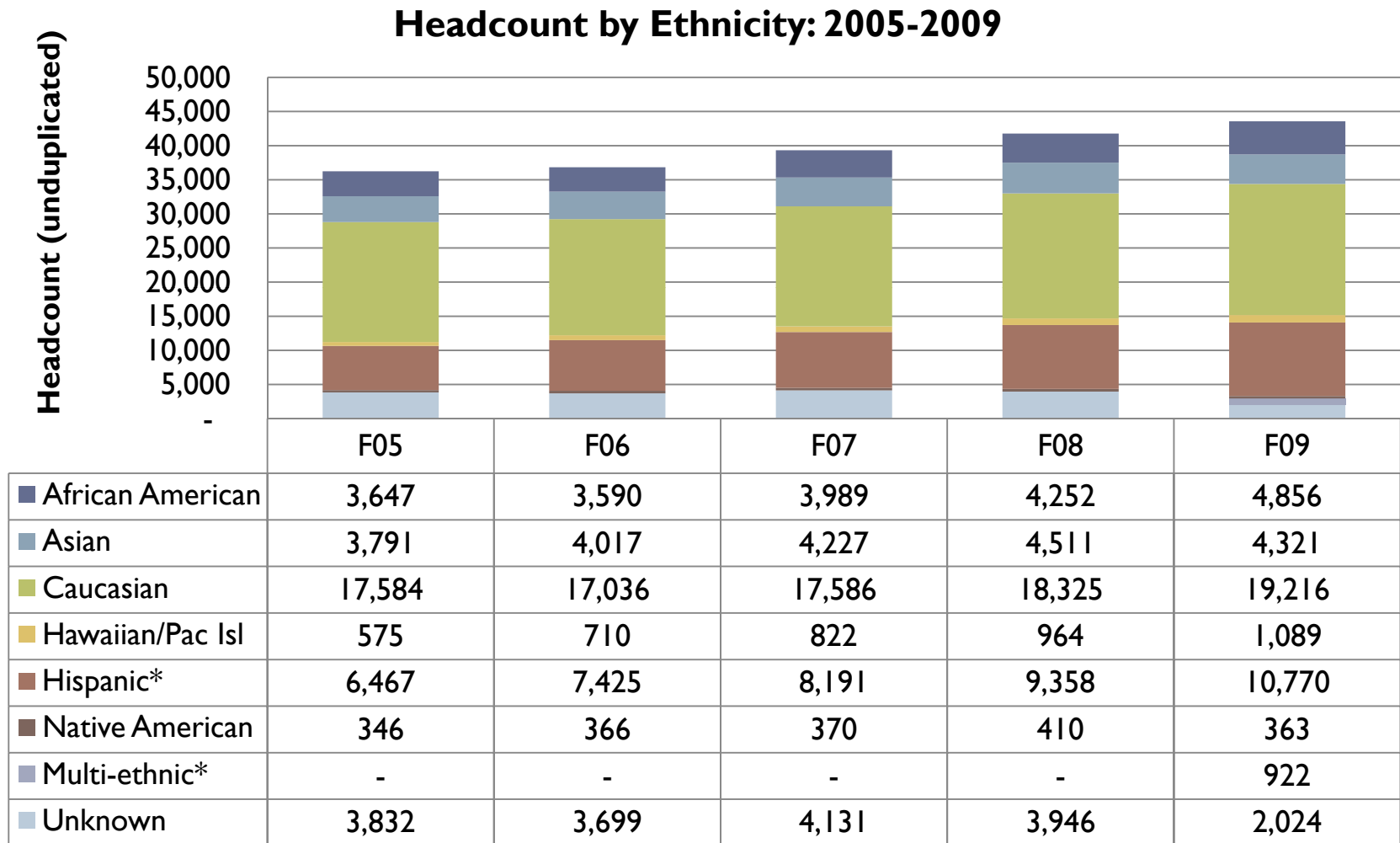

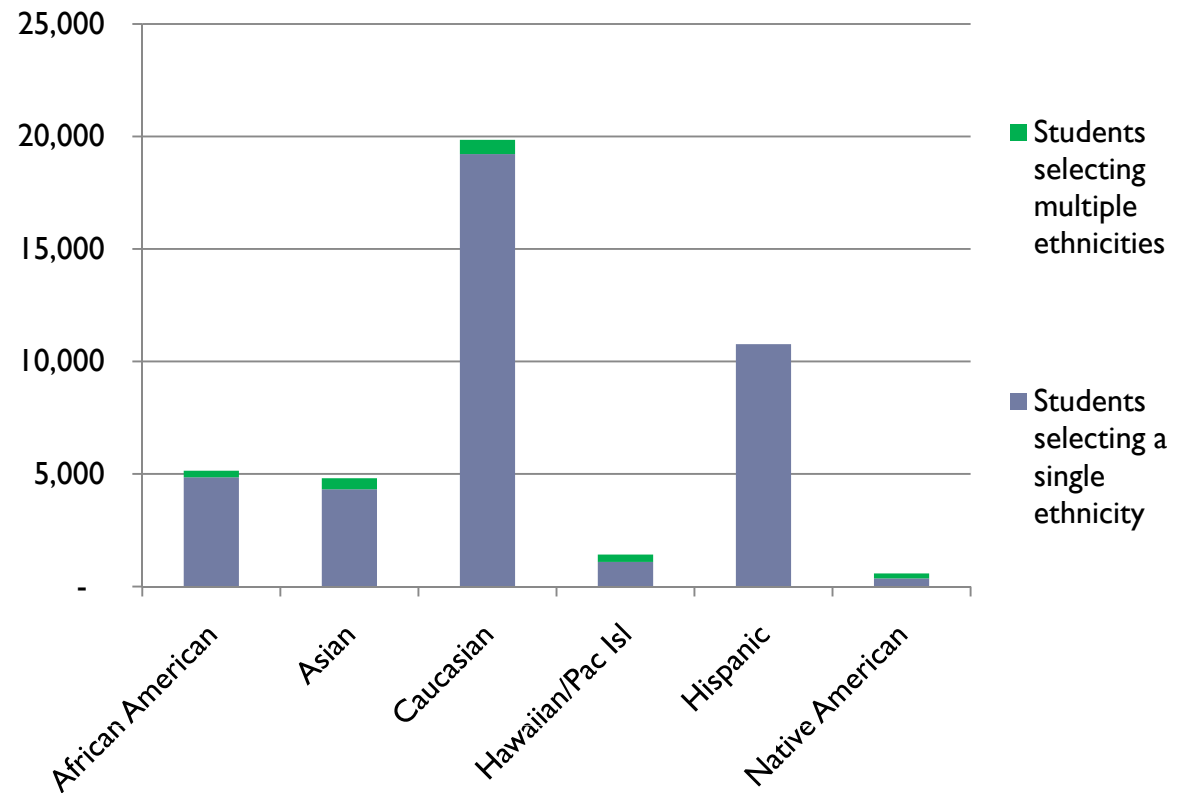

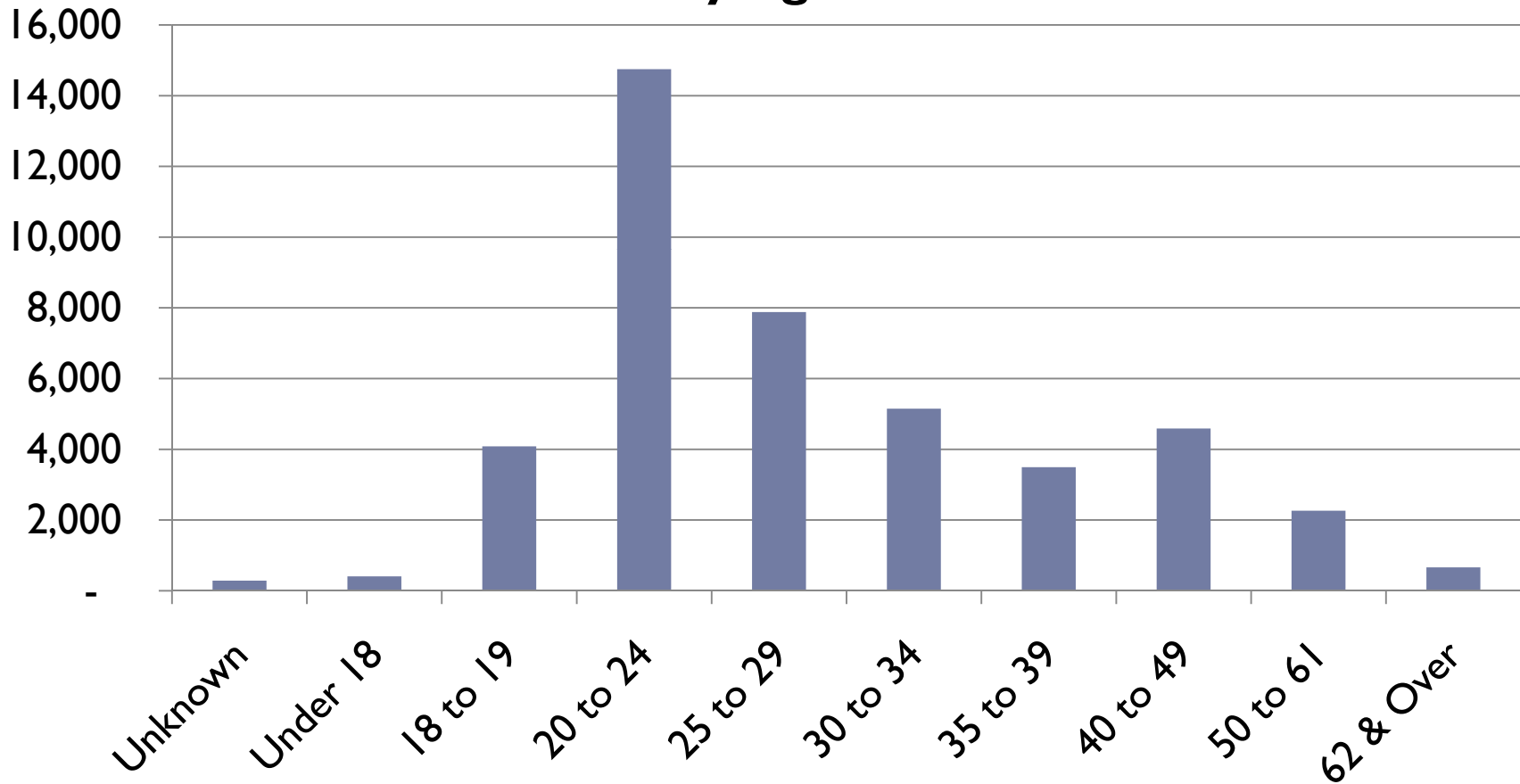

Enrollment by Ethnic Populations – Fall 2009



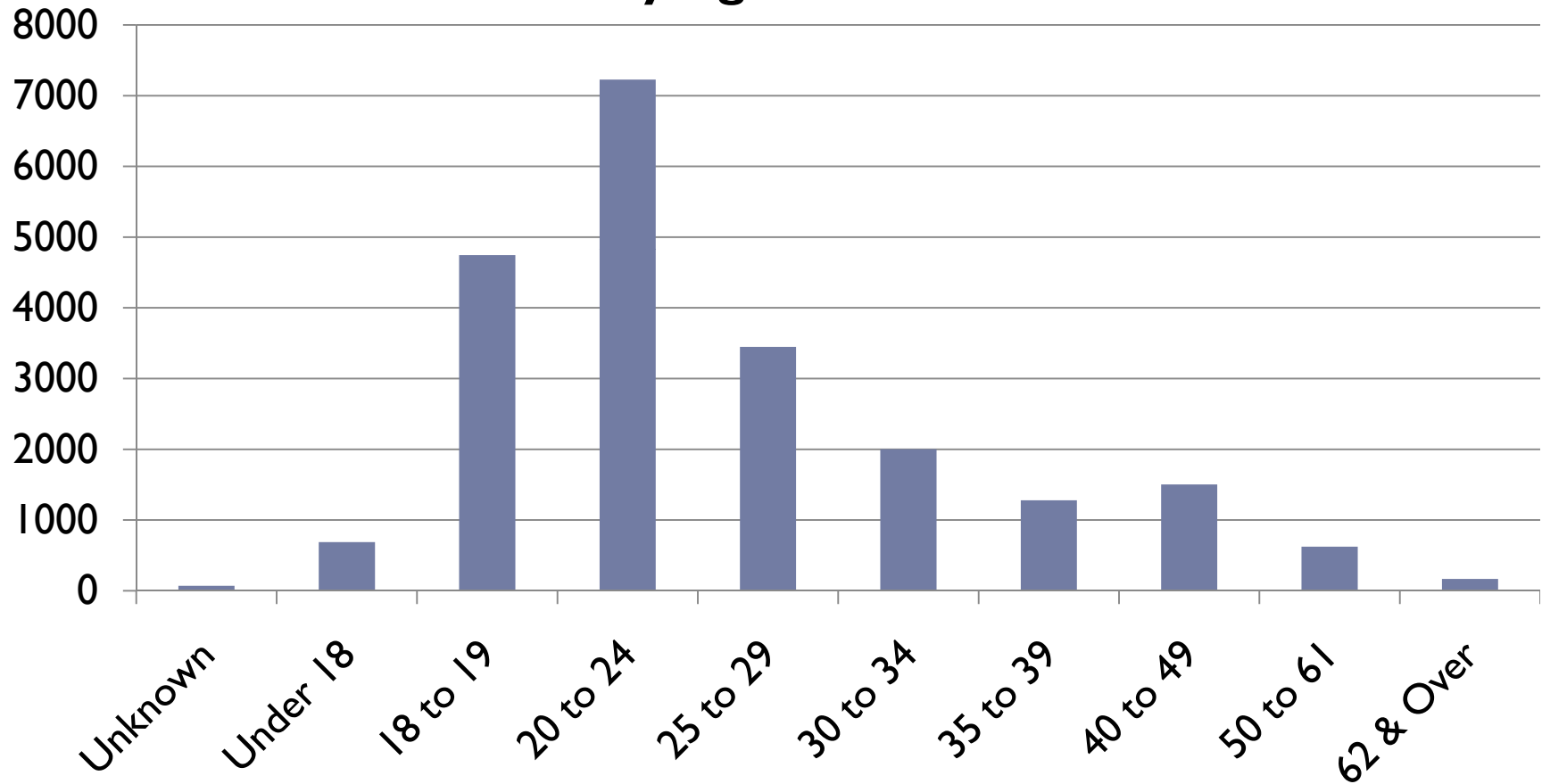

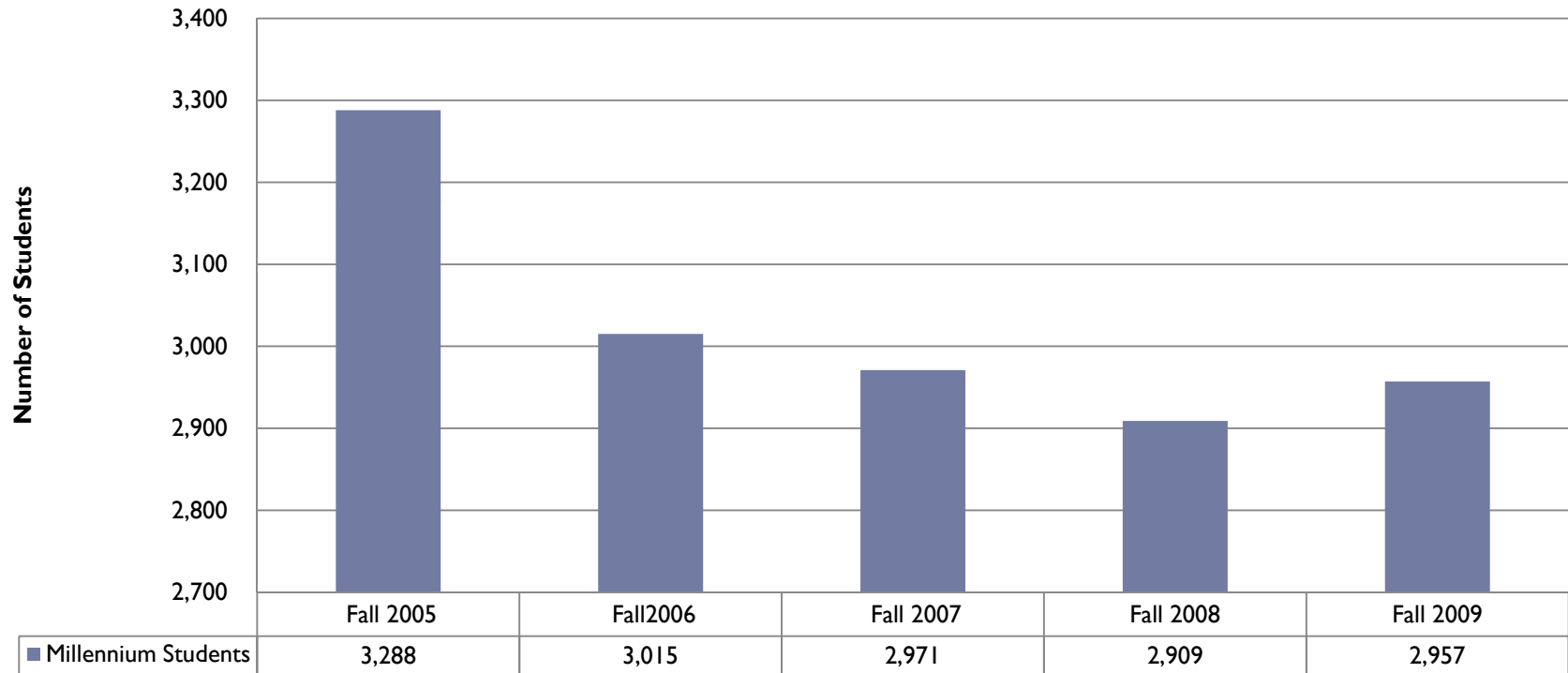

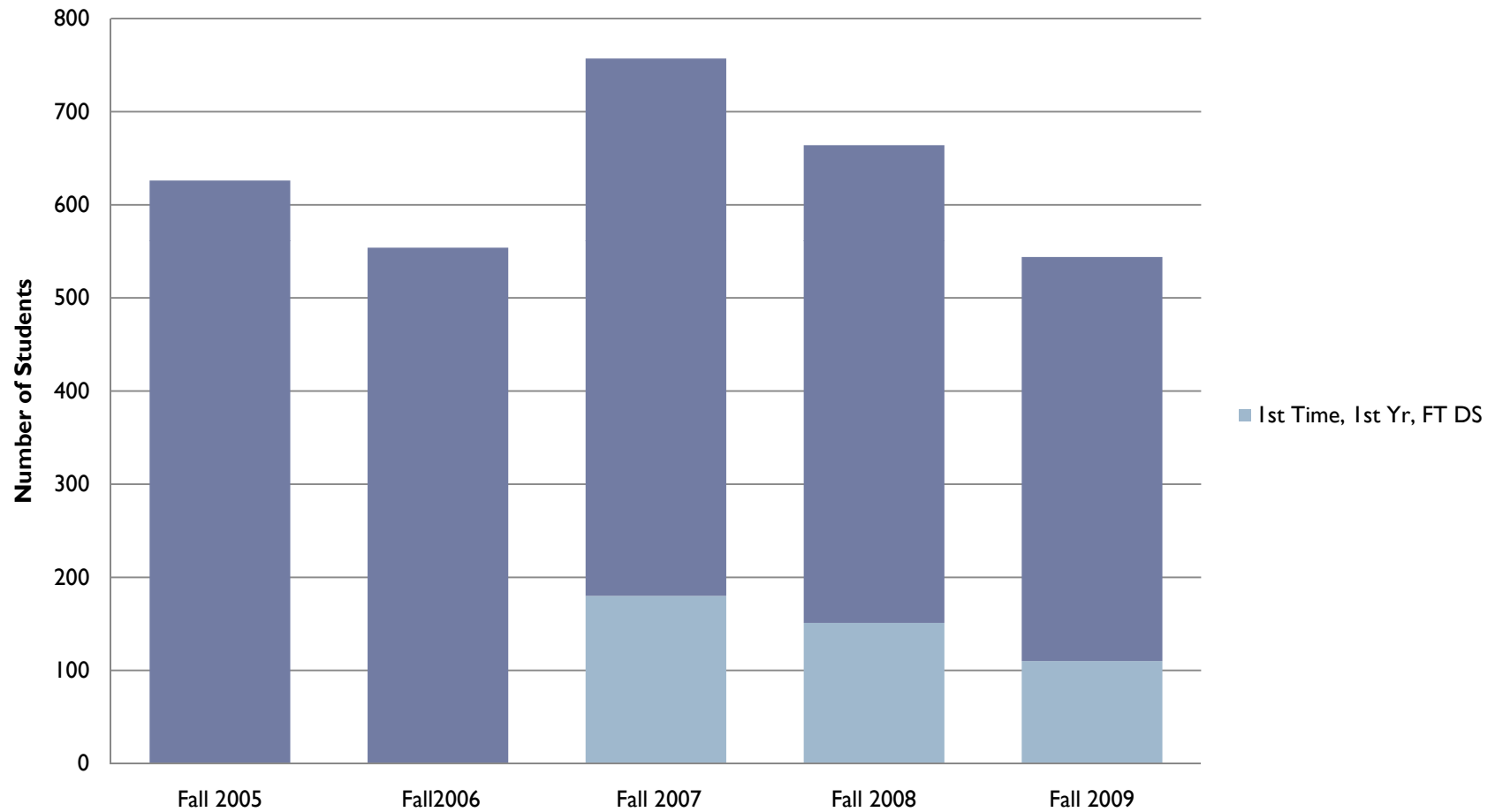

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## Course Retention (Grades A-F, P, NP) New Students and All Students

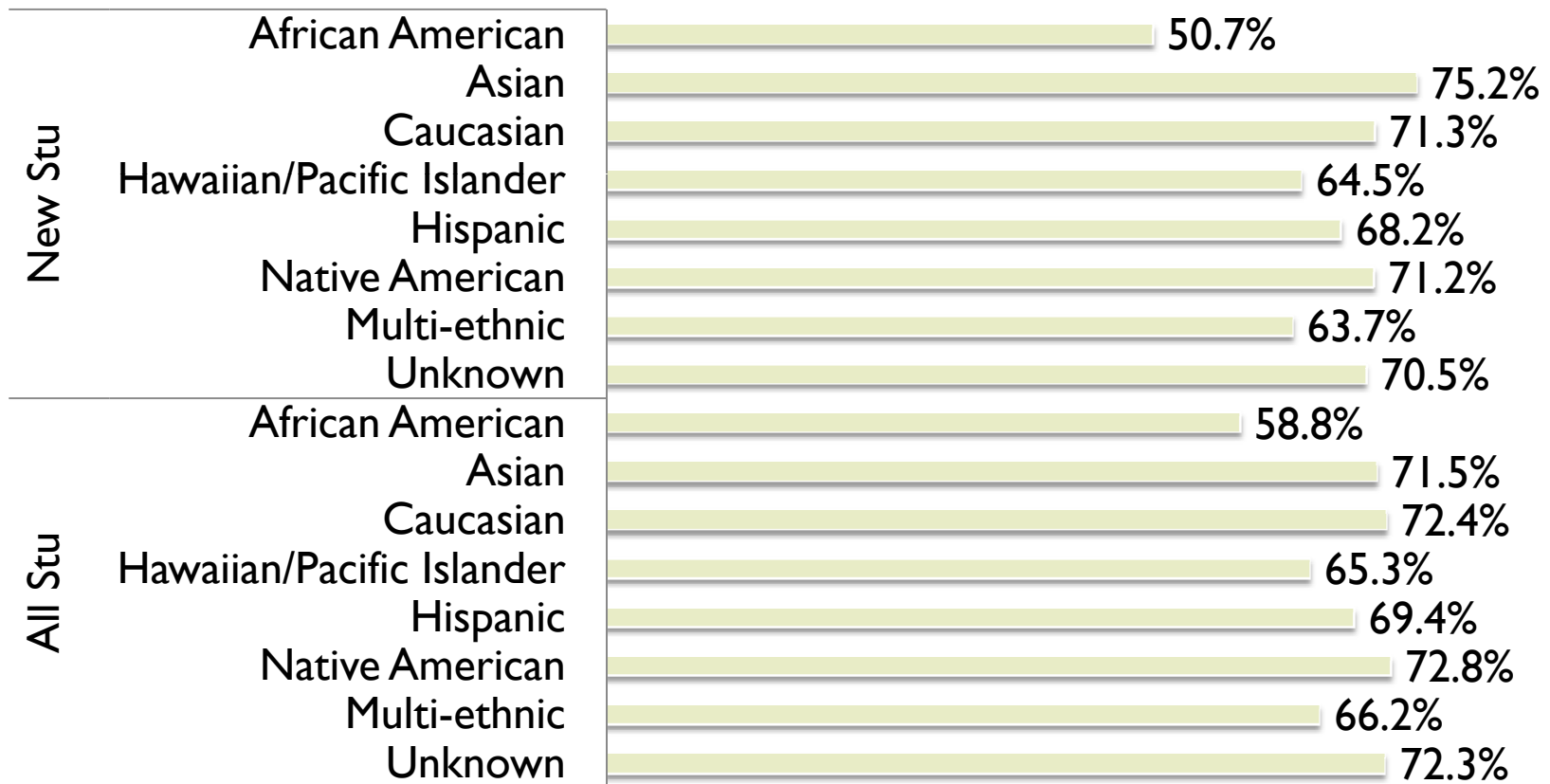

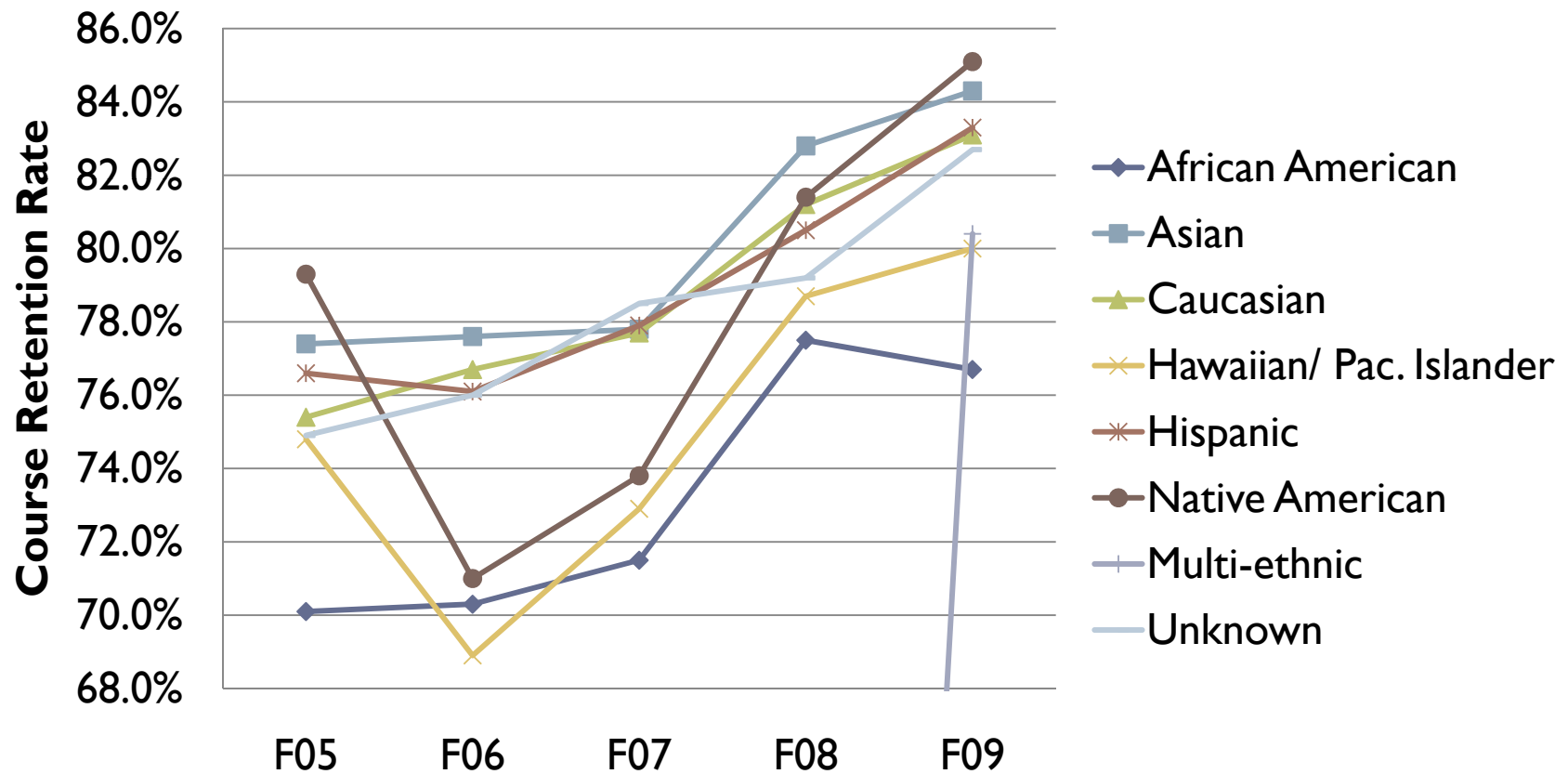
## Course Success (Grades A-C, P) New Students and All Students

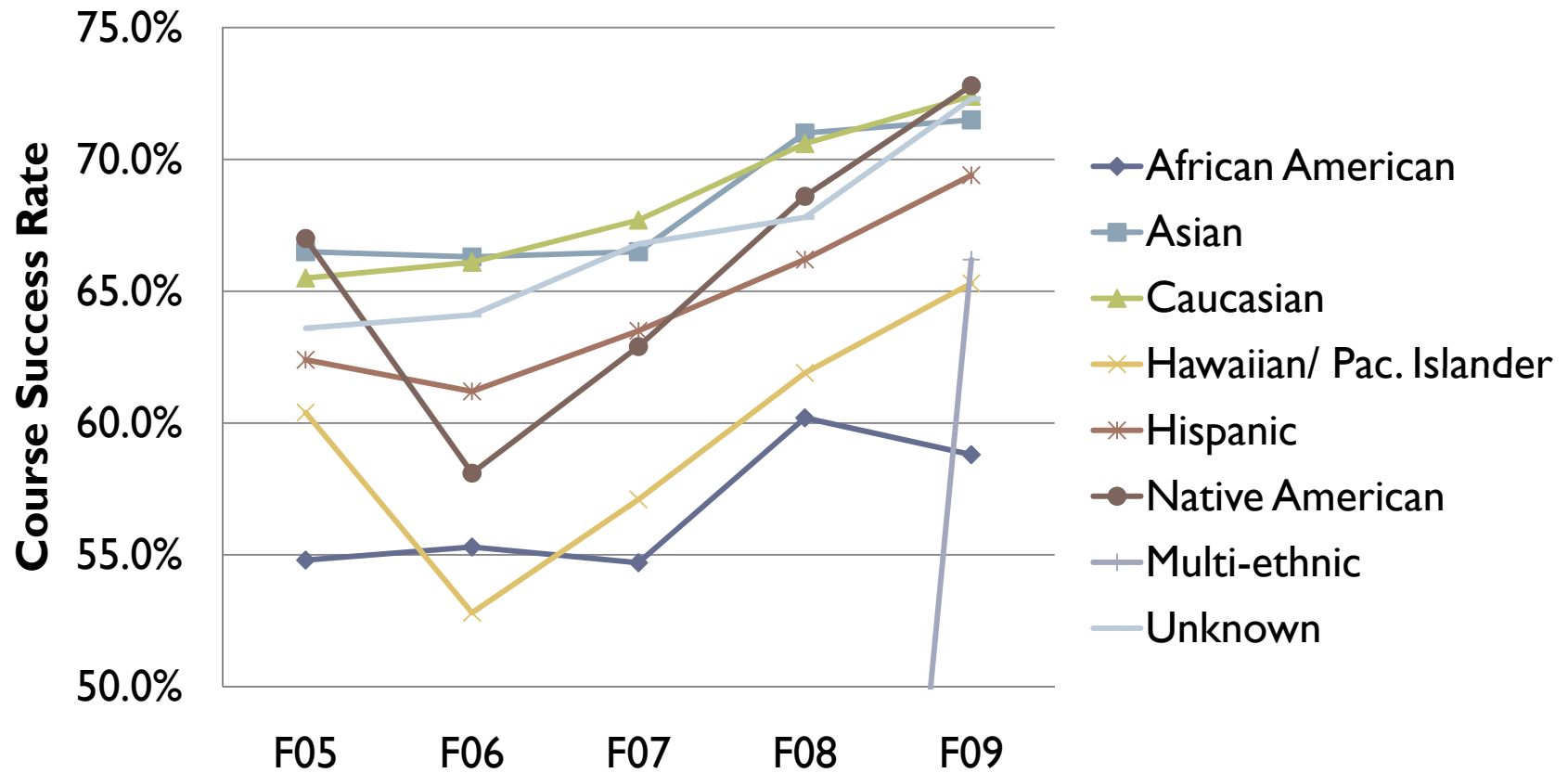
# Course Retention by Ethnicity: 2005-2009

## Course Retention (Grades A-F, P, NP) All Students by Ethnicity



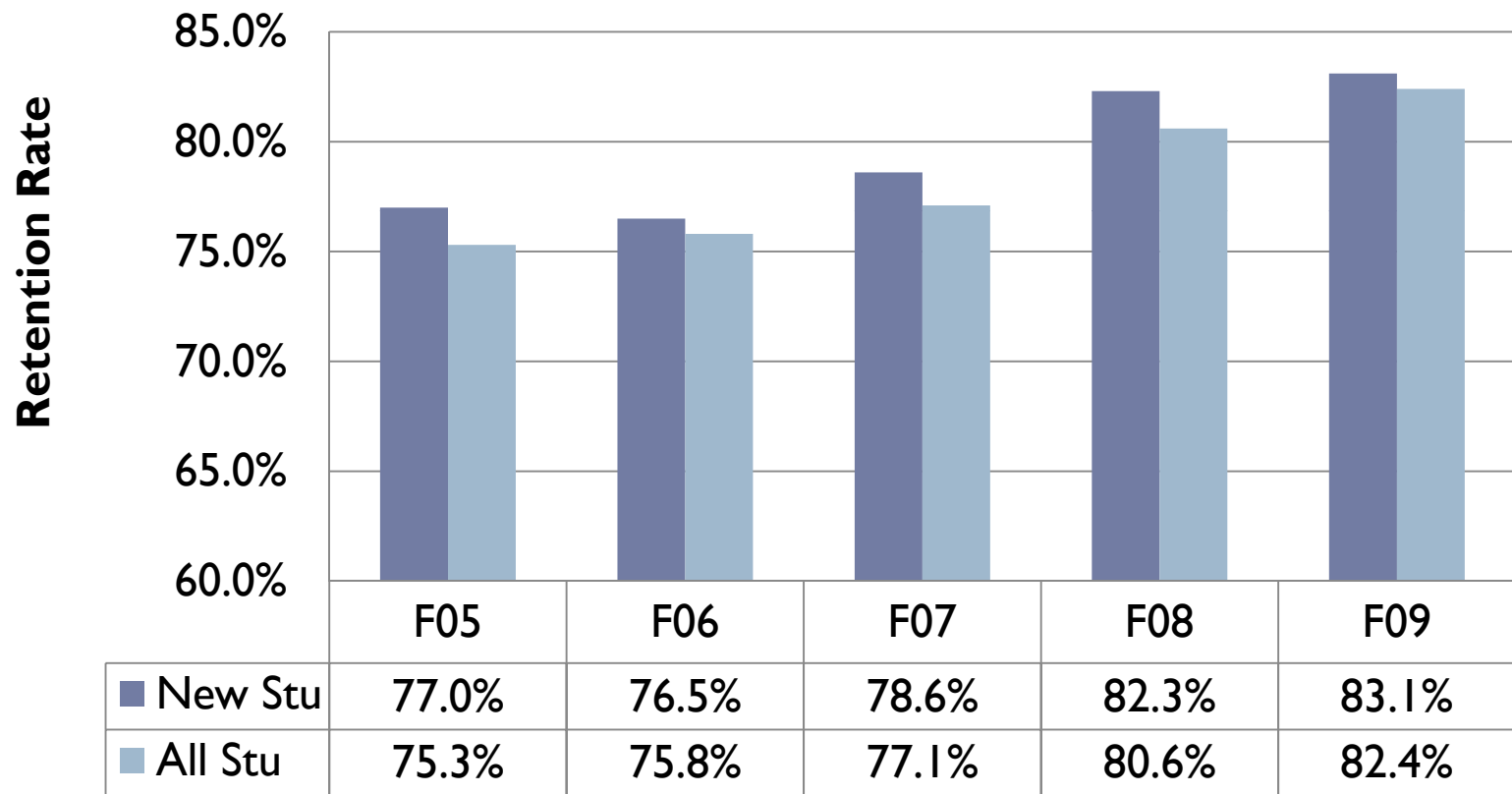

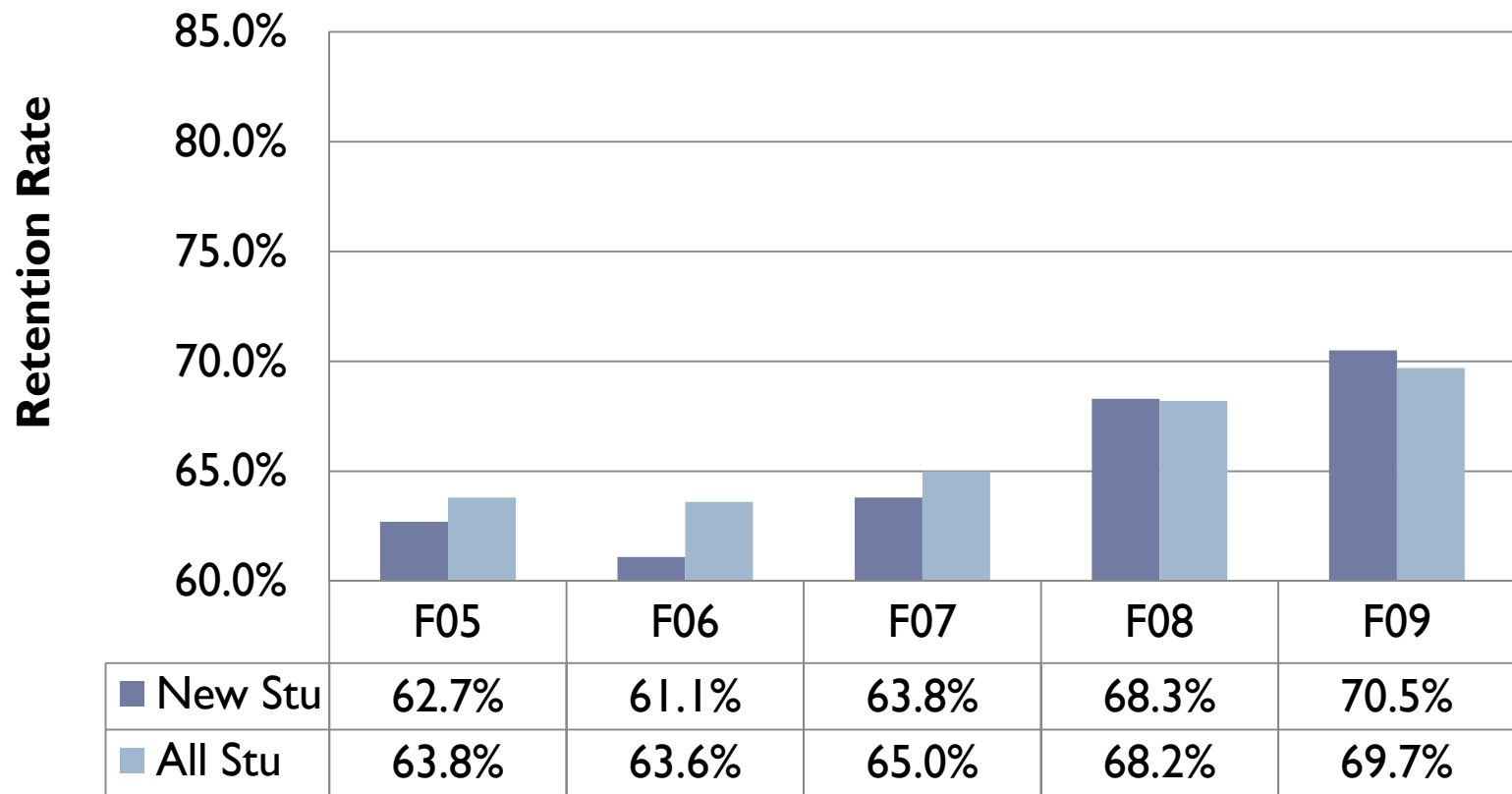

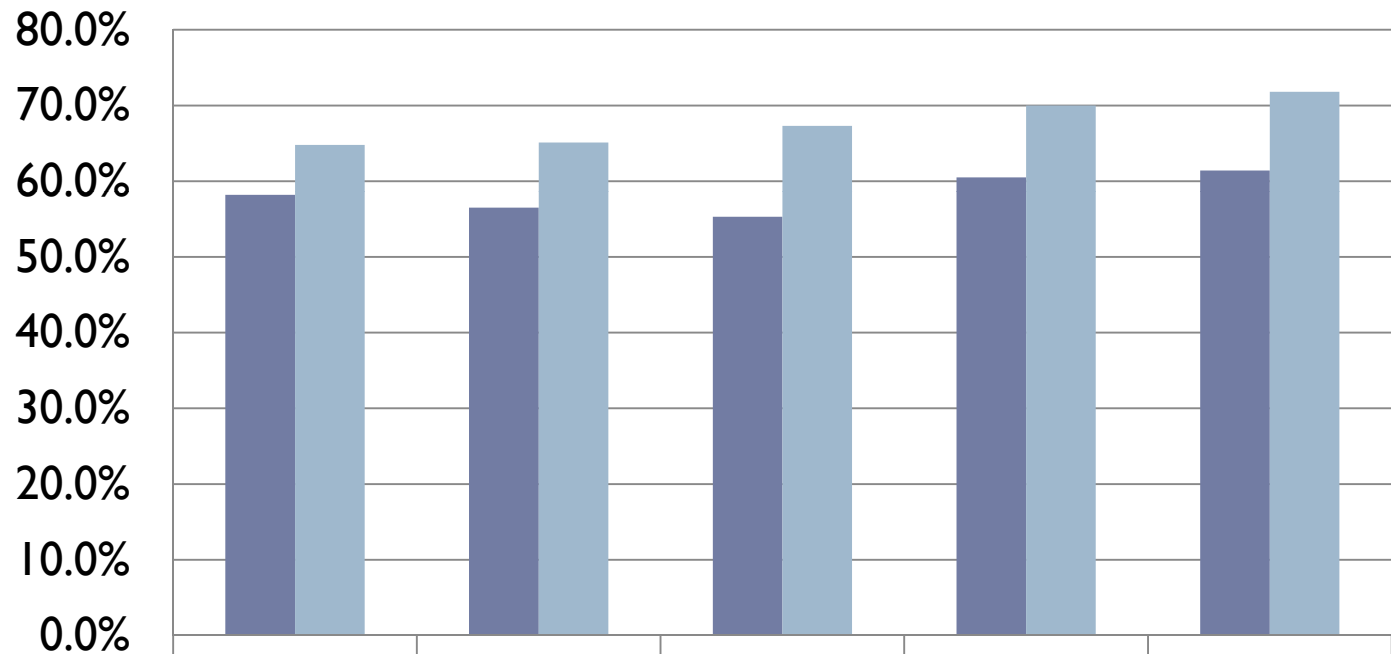

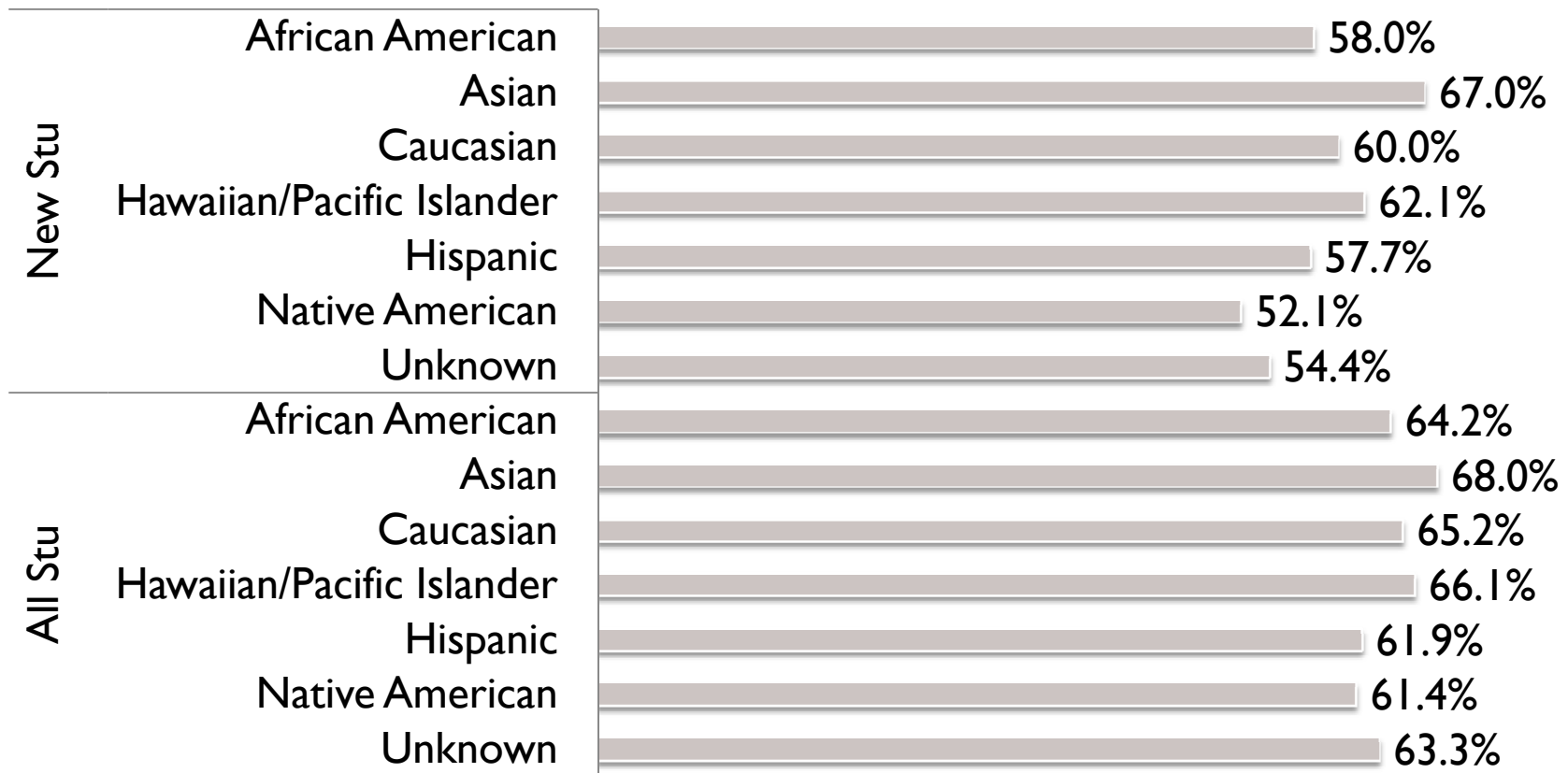

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## Next Term Persistence Fall 08-Spring09 New Students and All Students



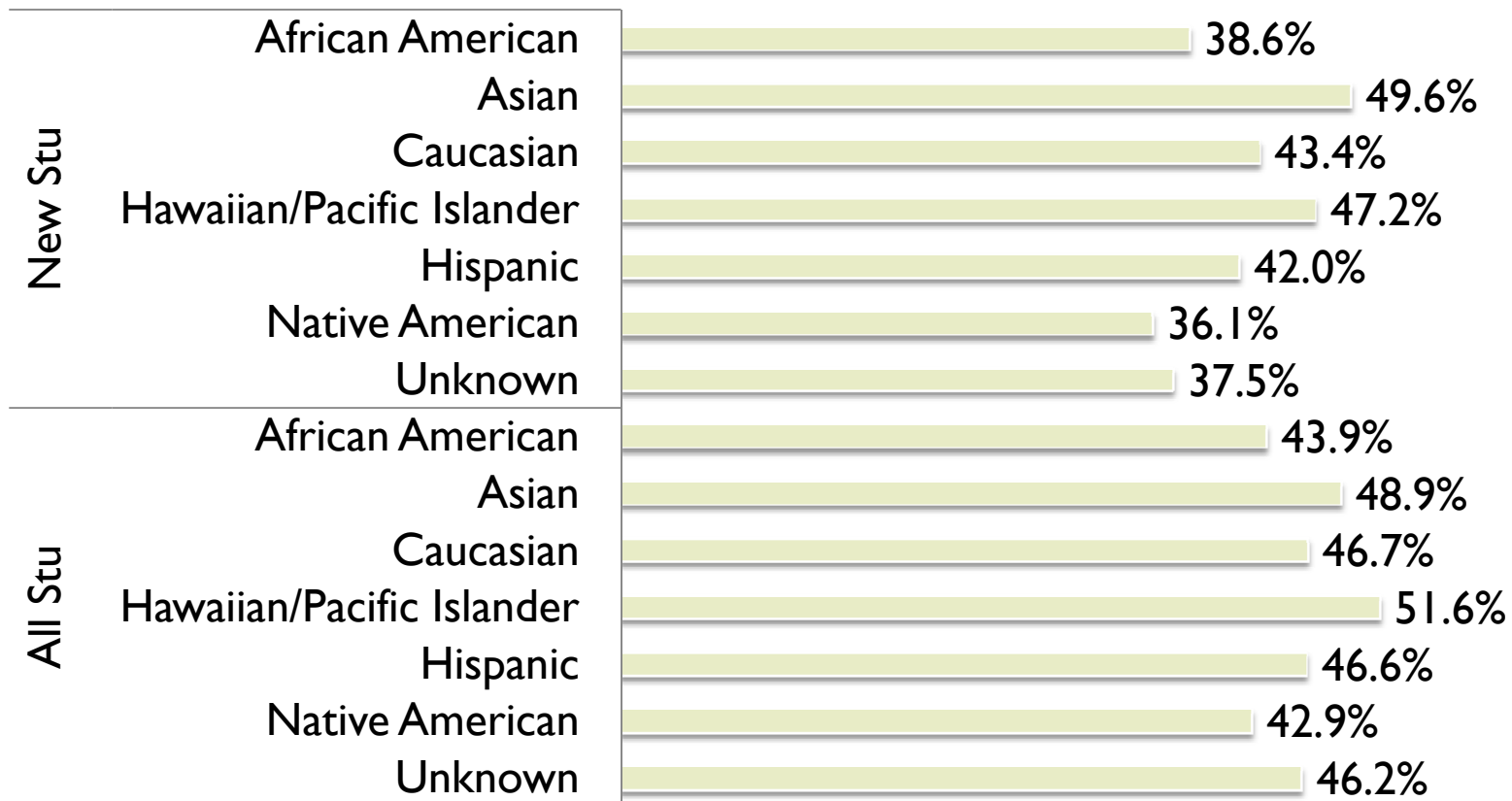

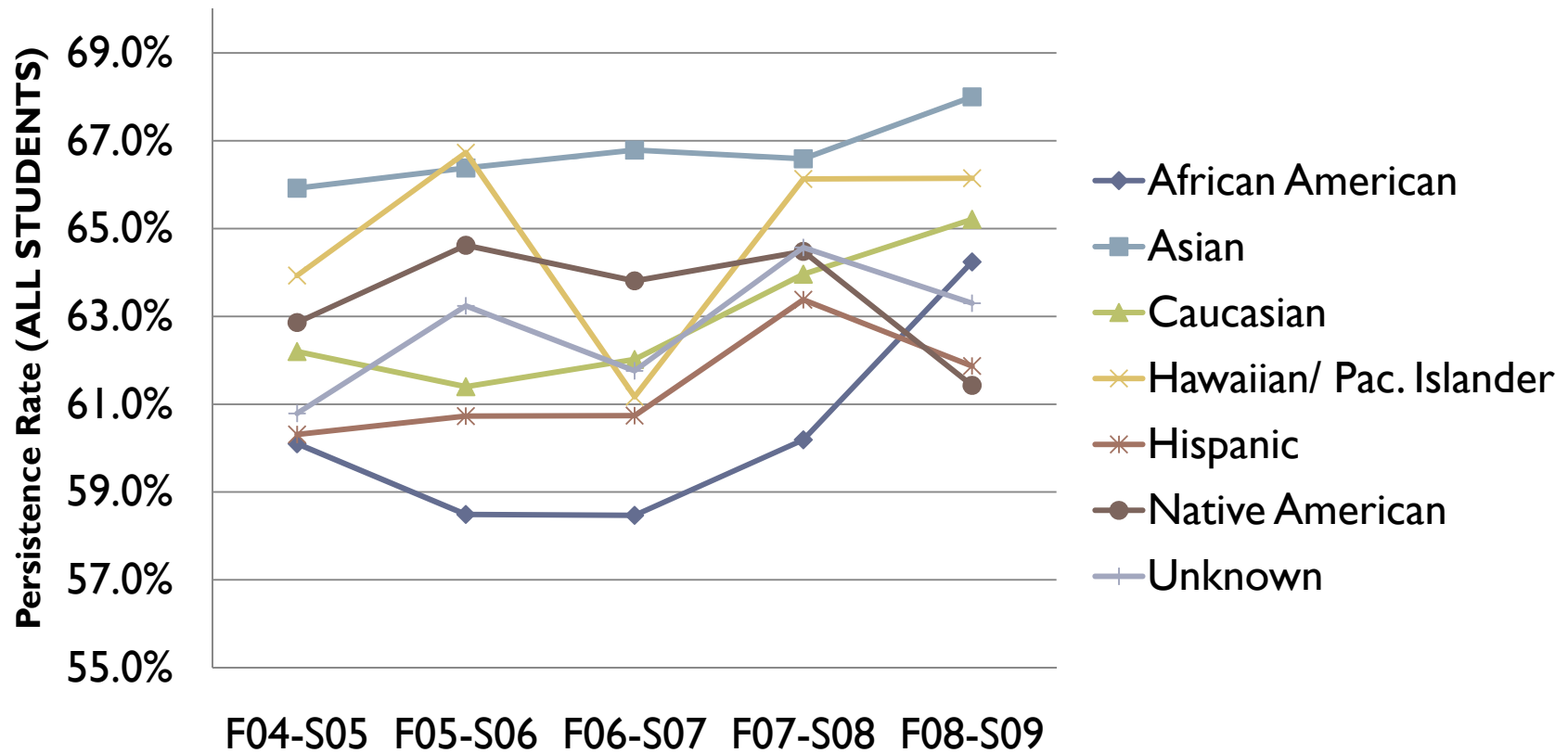

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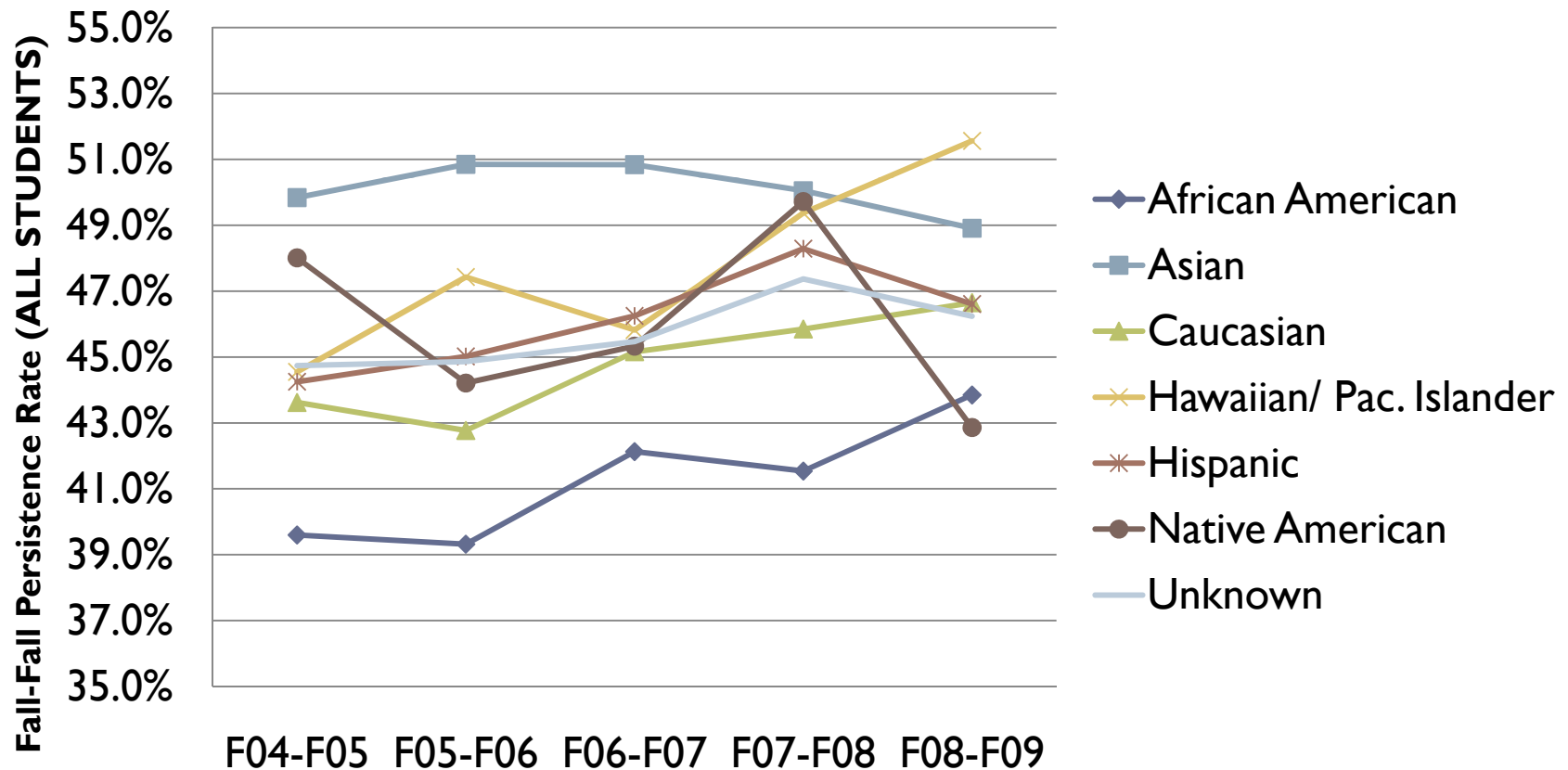
# Next Term Persistence by Ethnicity: 2005-2009

## Next Term Persistence - Fall to Spring By Ethnicity



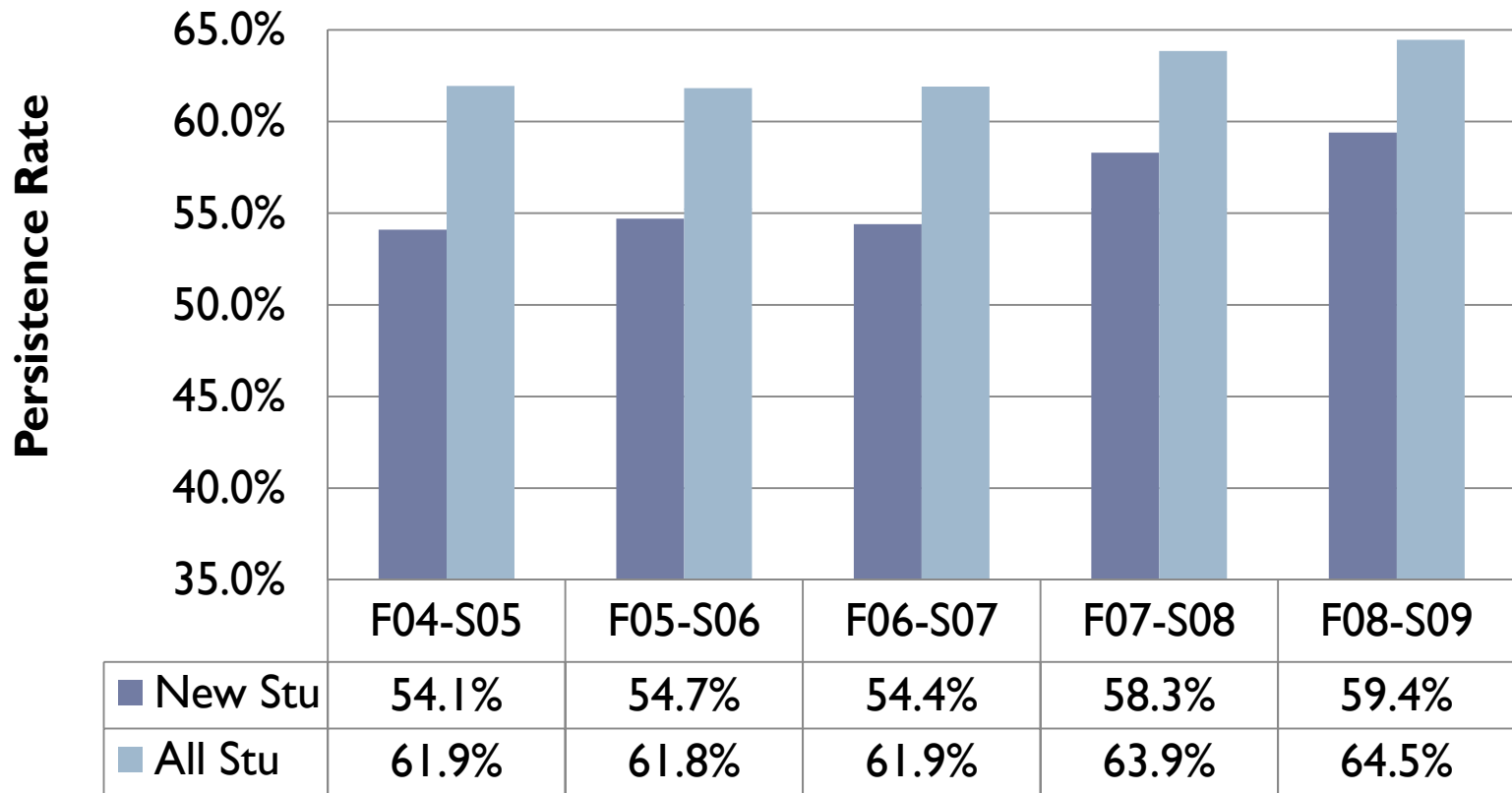

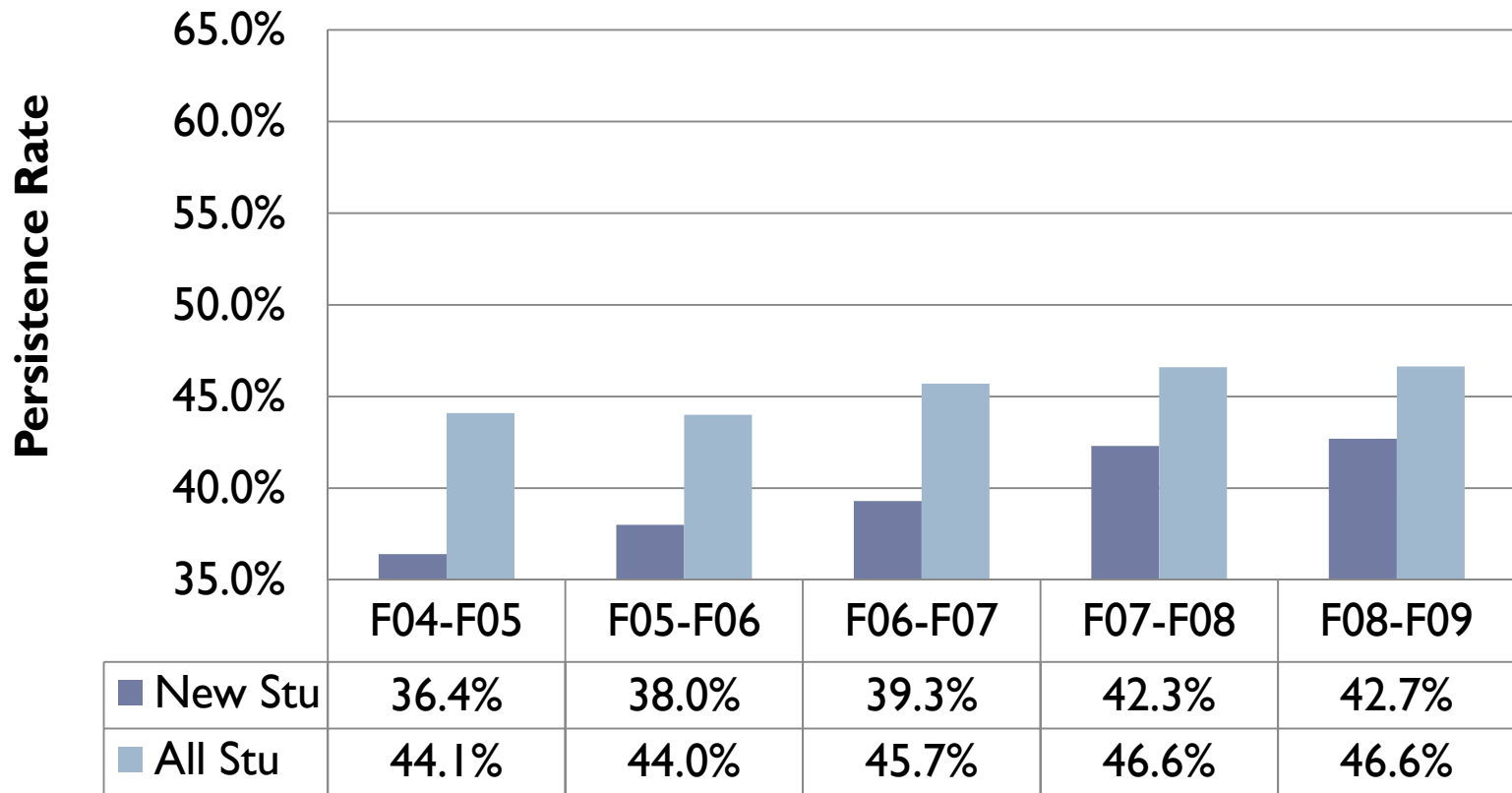

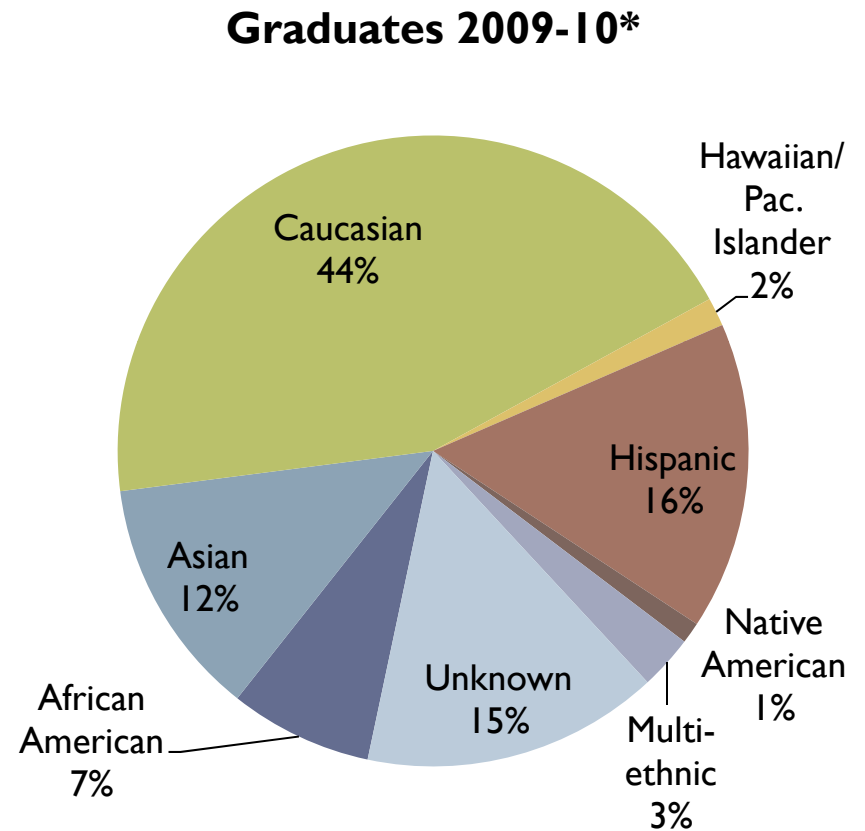

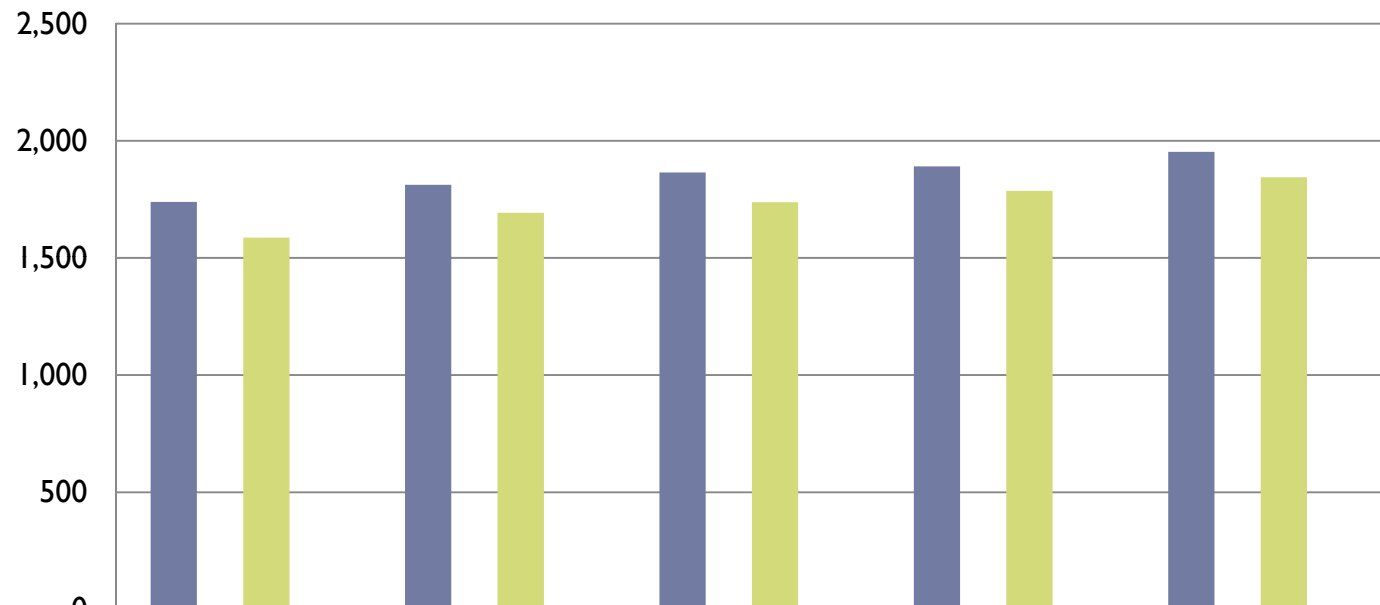

**Degrees/Certificates and Graduates: 2005-2010\***

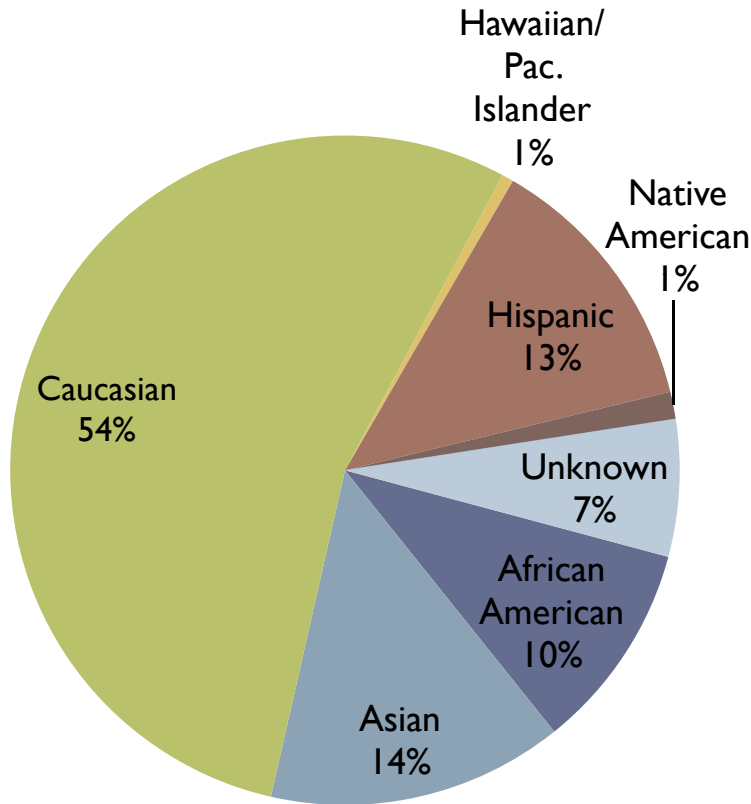

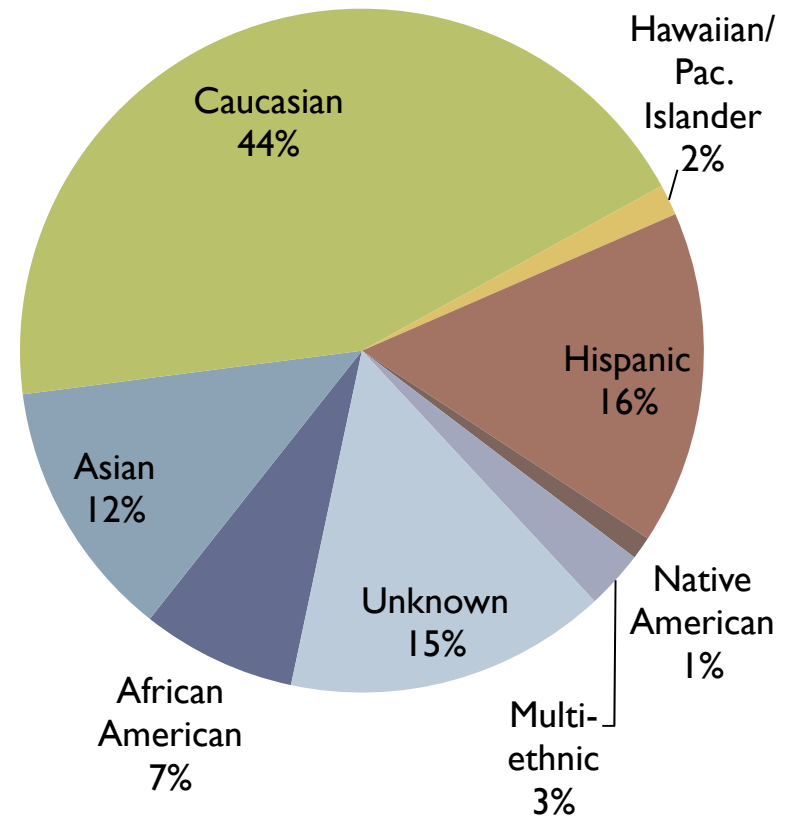

**Graduates 2005-06**



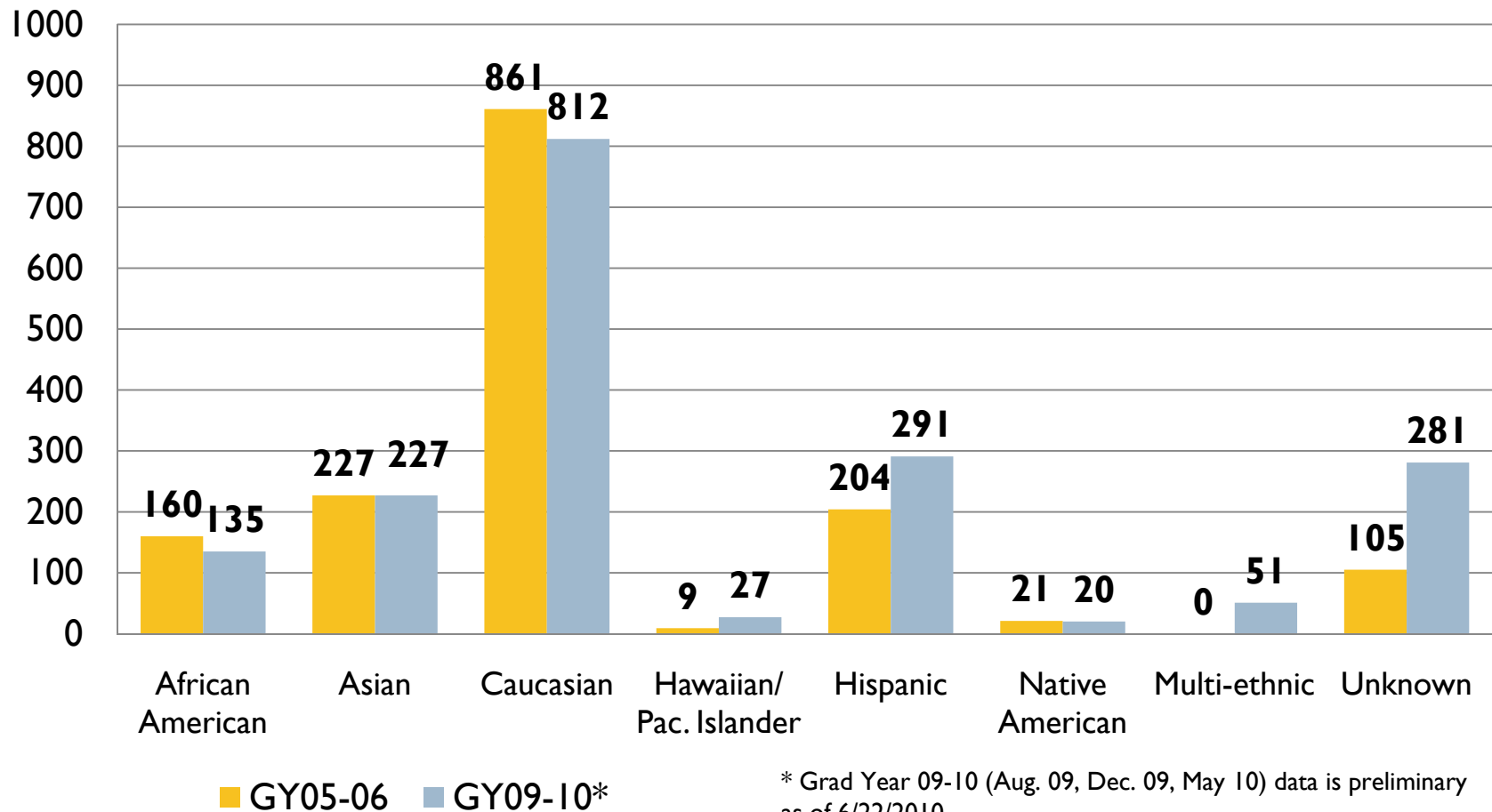
**Graduates 2009-10\***

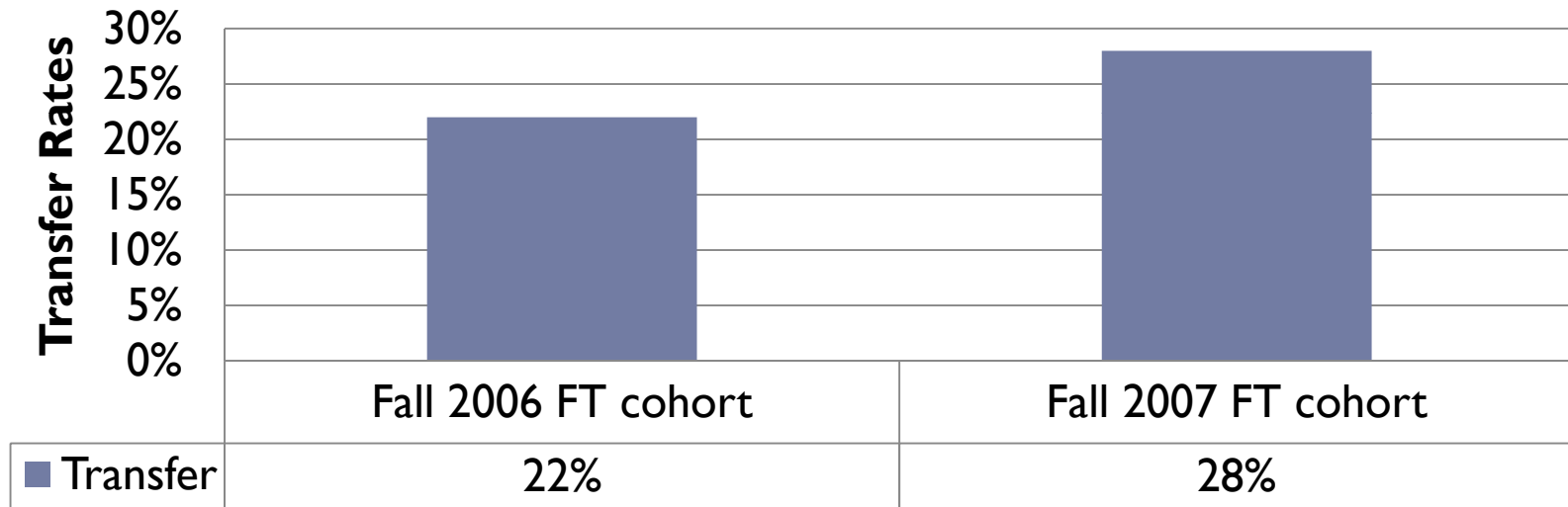
## Graduates by Ethnicity: 2005-06 and 2009-10\*

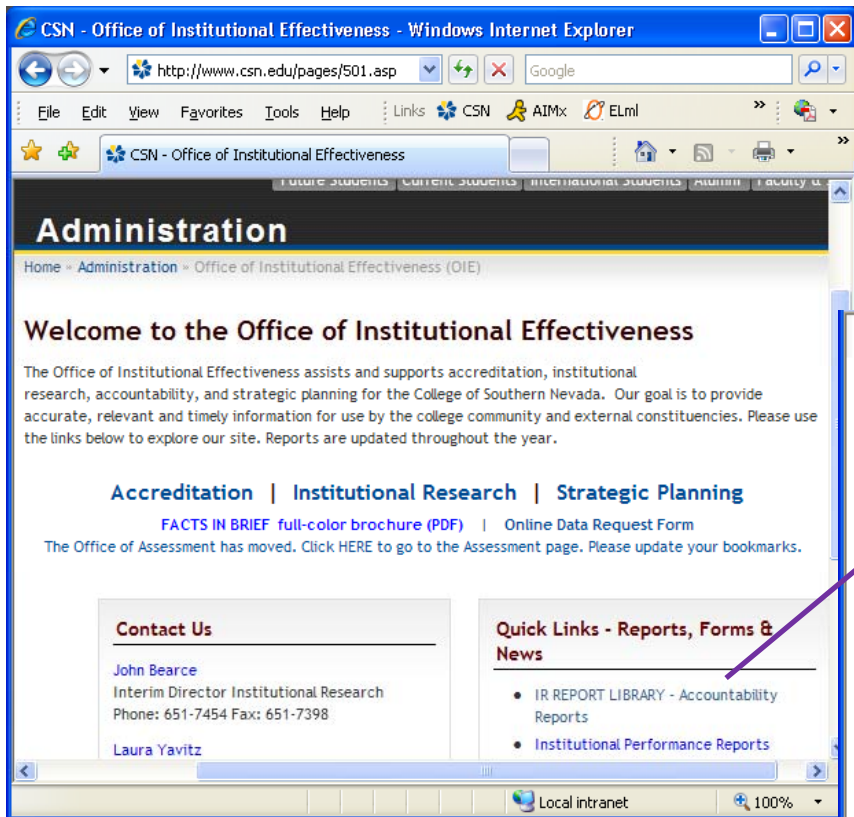
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## Transfer Rates - Fall 2007 IPEDS Entering Full-Time Students

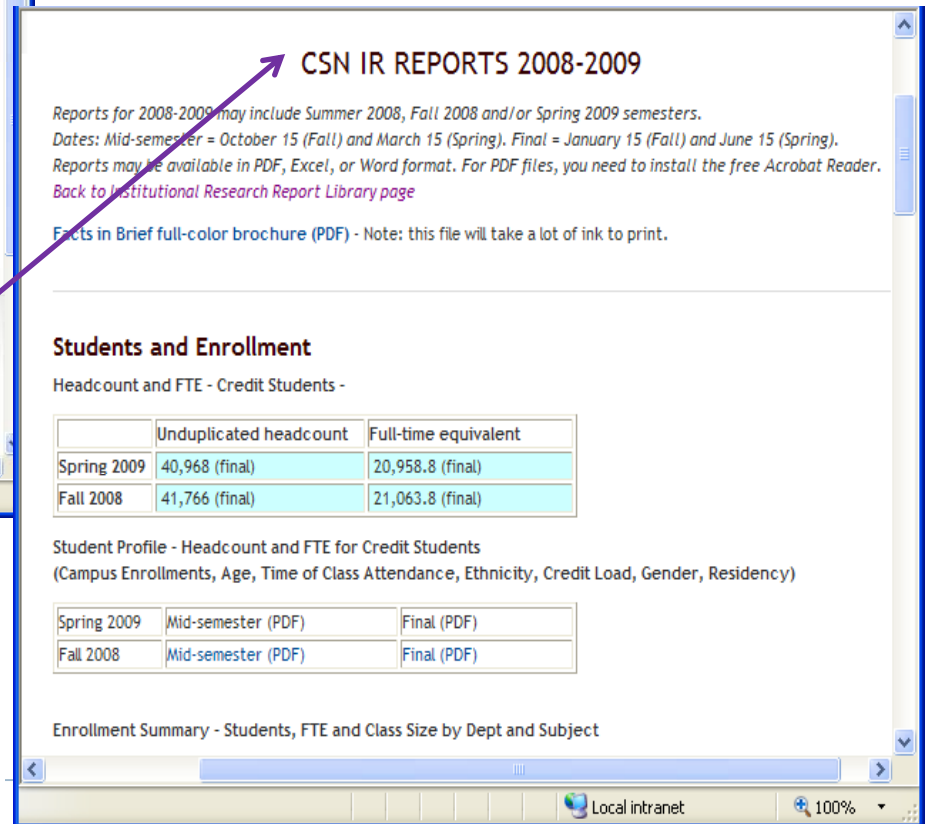


- IPEDS cohorts contain first-time first-year degree-seeking students. As such, cohorts are a limited subset of entering students.
