

Phlebotomy Skills Certificate (MLT/MLS Track)
Advisement Sheet
Certificate of Completion (6 credits)
 Spring, Summer, and Fall

The CSN Phlebotomy Skills Certificate of Completion program is a Selective Entry Program; therefore, all application qualification requirements must be completed by the application deadline in order to be eligible for consideration.

The Medical Laboratory Program will be responsible for managing the selection process. An admission committee will be responsible for selection of students. Only qualified applicants will be accepted into the program.

Qualified applicants must:

- Have a high school diploma, high school transcript, GED equivalent OR unofficial college or university transcripts showing an AWARDED degree AND
- Have declared an MLT or MLS major AND
- Have completed CHEM 103, 110, or 121 or equivalent with a grade of “C” or better AND
- Have completed MATH 126, MATH 126E or higher with a grade of “C” or better

ATTENTION: A clinical practicum (CLS 153) consisting of 120 hours of training at a specified clinical site is required for program completion. This rotation is typically completed within a 3-week period consisting of 8 hour days, Monday through Friday following the successful completion of CLS 151(Phlebotomy lecture) and 152 (Applied Phlebotomy laboratory).
