# **Program Description**

The program includes classroom instruction and clinical practice in adult health nursing, family health nursing, and mental health nursing

# **Application Deadline**

Students applying for the Fall 2024 program must submit an application to the Limited Entry Office by June 1, 2024. A "Limited Entry Application for Admission to a Health Science Program" may be obtained online at https://www.csn.edu/education-and-training/limited-entryadmission.

### **Accepted Students**

Students accepted into the program will be required to show proof of CPR certification, health insurance, and immunization against COVID-19, Hepatitis B, Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Varicella, Tetanus, and Diphtheria. In addition, proof of a negative two-step TB test and negative urine drug screen will be required.

A physical examination must also be completed. An official background check is required. This documentation is due at the mandatory advising session held during the week before classes begin each semester.

### Licensure as a Registered Nurse

Prospective students are advised that if they have been convicted of a felony prior to admission to the program that this may preclude subsequent licensure to practice as a nurse in Nevada (NRS 632.320).
