



CSN Adds Cheer & Dance Team to Athletics Department

The move helps CSN advance its mission of engaging local students with varied interests

June 28, 2019 – The College of Southern Nevada’s Athletics Department is inviting CSN students to try out for its brand-new Cheer and Dance team, launching this fall.

Veteran collegiate coach Tiffany Boulter will lead the program as a part-time coach.

“In the overall build out of our athletic program, we realize how critical cheer and dance are to our success,” Athletics Director Dexter Irvin said. “We are very cheerful about Tiffany and her experience in producing top-level students and performers.”

Boulter has a wide variety of experience in the collegiate cheer world, having been an assistant coach and then head coach of the Salt Lake Community College program. She also cheered at Utah Valley University and at Dixie State University.

“I am so excited to start up this program here at CSN,” Boulter said. “Cheer and dance are huge passions of mine and I can’t wait to work with some amazing athletes. I really want the program’s focus to be on school spirit and being involved in the community. I can’t wait to put the CSN Spirit Squad on the map.”

The Cheer and Dance team will advance CSN’s community mission of engaging local students with varied interests, while also supporting the Coyotes as they compete in intercollegiate athletics. At the outset, this co-ed team will not be in competition events. It will involve 30-40 full-time CSN students. The students are not on scholarship, and pay the typical fees for their CSN classes.

CSN has competed in intercollegiate athletics NJCAA Division I since 1999. Currently, the college has a men’s baseball team, a women’s softball team, both men’s and women’s soccer teams and a women’s volleyball team.
