



Nevada Promise Scholarship Deadline Approaching

The scholarship allows students to get a college degree free of mandatory tuition & fees

October 14, 2019 – High school seniors who want to go to college without having to pay tuition and mandatory fees should apply for the Nevada Promise Scholarship as soon as possible. The application deadline is October 31.

“The Nevada Promise Scholarship is one of the very best tools we have for giving our state’s students access to a college education,” said CSN President Dr. Federico Zaragoza. “As CSN focuses on its student success mission, we couldn’t be more pleased that this game-changing scholarship is bringing so many new students to college.”

The scholarship, now in its third year, will pay all tuition and mandatory fees for up to three years at any Nevada community college minus after federal or state financial aid has been applied. In addition to the financial benefits, students in the program benefit from special programming and assistance to make their transition into college successful, perform required community service and work with a mentor who can help guide them through college.

“If it weren’t for Nevada Promise I most likely wouldn’t have been able to go to college because of the financial strain that comes with being a full-time student,” said recipient and CSN student Mexley Morales. “The mentoring and community service have been really beneficial to me too. The staff really puts a lot of thought into making sure the students are doing well. The Promise scholarship is so much more than the money.”

This year’s high school seniors and students who received the scholarship last year are eligible to apply. CSN received thousands of applications last year and admitted hundreds of students who are receiving the scholarship.
