ANSI/ISEA Z308.1-2021 establishes minimum performance requirements for first aid kits and their supplies that are intended for use in various work environments.

Class A Kits are designed to deal with the most common types of workplace injuries, such as minor cuts, abrasions and sprains.

Class B Kits are designed to deal with injuries in more complex or high-risk environments and contain a broader range and quantity of supplies.

Supplemental First Aid Supplies

First Aid Supply	Purpose
Blue Adhesive Bandages, Metal-Detectable	Used in food preparation and culinary areas.
Blue Finger Cots	Used in food preparation and culinary areas.
Hot Pack	Available in Student Union Lactation Room and Den.
Permanent Marker	Used to record the time tourniquet was applied, part of the Stop the Bleed program.
Splinter Remover	Available in Class B Kits.
Wound Closure Strips	Available in Class B Kits.
