

The most important consideration of issuing a timely warning is to first alert the campus community about a potential threat or an ongoing concern so as to keep the community safe, regardless of whether the crime is classified as a reportable crime; where it occurred; or who is the perpetrator or the victim. A campus wide “timely warning” may be issued per requirements of the Jeanne Clery Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1092(f) et seq.

ON-CAMPUS: Indecent Exposure/ Open and Gross Lewdness

The College of Southern Nevada Police Department has recently noted an increase in received reports of indecent exposure and open and gross lewdness. These indecent exposure and open and gross lewdness incidents have been reported during the day on weekends at the Cheyenne and West Charleston campuses between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.

A suspect has been seen on campus recently during the periods that the incidents have been reports. In these instances, the suspect began to speak to a female and proceeded to follow the woman throughout the campus romantically pursuing her. After attempting to pursue the victim, the suspect exposed his genitalia and/or openly gratified himself in public view.

Following the tips provided below will help to keep you safe. Remember...

1. Don't engage in conversation with strangers,
2. Keep on a lookout of your surroundings and be aware of suspicious looking individuals;
3. Walk with friends or individuals with whom you are familiar when possible;
4. Stay in populated, well-lit areas;
5. Keep your cell phone handy to contact the proper authorities,
6. Have your routes planned out when you walk to or from your destination; and
7. Walk purposefully to help avoid giving suspects the opportunity to approach you.

Again, the intent of this warning is to enable members of the campus community to protect themselves. If you see something, say something and immediately report it to the proper authorities listed below.
