The Certificate of Achievement is an 18-month program that provides students with the opportunity to acquire the knowledge, skills and abilities to obtain employment in the safety management field. Courses cover such areas as ergonomics, safety laws and regulations and industrial hygiene. Classroom and laboratory course work is accomplished.
