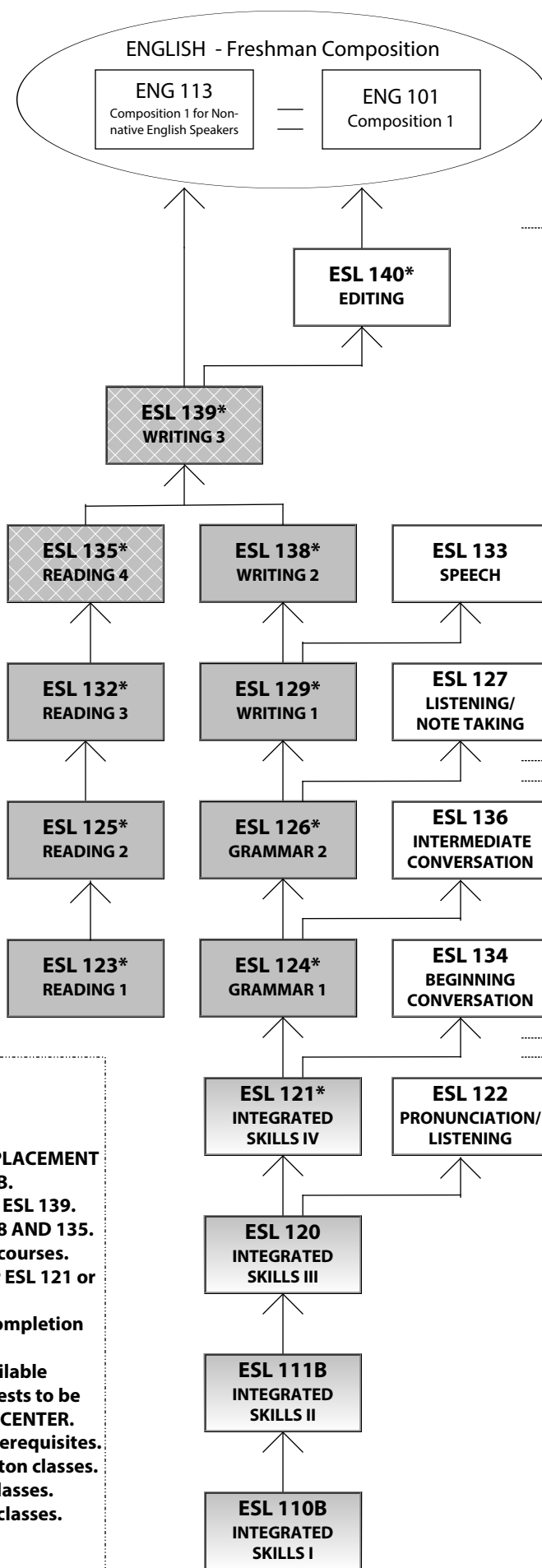


ESL to English Course Sequence

Updated
Fall 2015



ADVANCED

Upon completion of ESL 135 and 139, students will be able to function at an advanced level of ESL in reading, writing, and grammar to enter ENG 101 or ENG 113. Students will be able to compose and edit essays using conventions of standard English. Optional ESL 133 improves students' ability to write and deliver professional speeches and ESL 127 improves note-taking and listening skills.

INTERMEDIATE

Upon completion of ESL 126 and 125, students will be able to function at an intermediate-mid level of ESL in reading, writing, and grammar. Students will be able to write varied sentences and summaries. Optional ESL 134 and 136 enhances students' ability to speak more fluently and accurately.

BEGINNING

Upon completion of ESL 121, students will be able to function at a beginning-high level of ESL in basic reading, writing, listening, speaking, and grammar. Students will be able to read and write simple sentences with appropriate grammar and vocabulary, understand basic speech, and communicate basic needs. Optional ESL 122 enhances students' ability to produce clearer speech.

Important Notes

1. To take an ESL class, take the **ESL PLACEMENT TEST** in a CSN campus LANGUAGE LAB.
2. To exit the ESL Program, complete ESL 139.
3. To enter ESL 139, complete ESL 138 AND 135.
4. ESL 139 and ESL 135 are capstone courses.
5. Reading classes can only start after ESL 121 or before with instructor permission.
6. ESL 140 is by the placement test, completion of ESL 139 or instructor permission.
7. An * signifies that the course is available online; online courses require some tests to be completed at a CSN campus TESTING CENTER.
