

## CSN Jumpstart Concurrent Enrollment Courses Approved for Concurrent Enrollment and Instructor Qualifications

The qualifications to teach concurrent enrollment courses vary by academic department. For detailed information on instructor qualifications by discipline, view the following table of courses and the instructor qualifications needed to teach these courses.

Field of Study	Course	Course Title	Instructor Qualifications
<b>Academics and Life Success</b>	ALS 101	Academic and Life Success (3 credits)	Required: Master's degree in Education, Counseling, Educational Psychology, Student Personnel Services, and/or Educational Leadership from a regionally accredited college/university. College teaching or work experience in the area of college success/personal development courses (community college experience preferred). An interview with the Lead Faculty or other English Department representative will be required prior to approval to teach ALS 101 for the Jumpstart Program.
<b>Biology</b>	BIO 101	Biology for Non-Majors (4 credits)	Biological Science are an MS degree in Biology or a closely related discipline such as Zoology. Please note that the MS degree must include research leading to a thesis or dissertation (in the case of a Ph.D.) Master of Arts degrees and Master of Education degrees that do not involve research are typically not acceptable.
<b>Chemistry</b>	CHEM 103	Preparatory Chemistry (3 credits)	Master of Chemistry; OR Master in a related field, plus <b>18</b> graduate credits in Chemistry.
<b>Chemistry</b>	CHEM 105	Chemistry, Man and Society (3 credits)	Master of Chemistry OR a Master in a related field, plus <b>18</b> graduate credits in Chemistry.
<b>Chemistry</b>	CHEM 106	Beginning Chemistry Laboratory (1 credit)	Bachelor of Chemistry.
<b>Communications</b>	COM 101	Oral Communication (3 credits)	A Master in Speech, Rhetoric, Communication Studies, Speech Communication, or Organizational Communication.
<b>Communications</b>	COM 102	Introduction to Interpersonal Communication (3 credits)	A Master in Speech, Rhetoric, Communication Studies, Speech Communication, or Organizational Communication.
<b>Culinary Arts</b>	FAB 160	Hospitality Purchasing (3 credits)	Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university. Direct food service management experience or culinary nutrition experience. Preferred Qualifications: Master's degree in a related field from a regionally accredited college of university.

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<b>Culinary Arts</b>	FAB 167	Food Service Nutrition (2 credits)	Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university. Direct food service management experience or culinary nutrition experience. Preferred Qualifications: Master's degree in a related field from a regionally accredited college of university.
<b>English</b>	ENG 100	Composition Enhanced (5 credits)	Master's degree in English <b>or</b> a master's degree in a closely related discipline (Closely related disciplines would include Education, Linguistics, or Liberal Arts. Creative Writing teachers may need to demonstrate graduate work in specific areas) <b>plus</b> 18 graduate credits in English.
<b>English</b>	ENG 101	Composition I (3 credits)	Master's degree in English <b>or</b> a master's degree in a closely related discipline (Closely related disciplines would include Education, Linguistics, or Liberal Arts. Creative Writing teachers may need to demonstrate graduate work in specific areas) <b>plus</b> 18 graduate credits in English.
<b>English</b>	ENG 102	Composition II (3 credits)	Master's degree in English <b>or</b> a master's degree in a closely related discipline (Closely related disciplines would include Education, Linguistics, or Liberal Arts. Creative Writing teachers may need to demonstrate graduate work in specific areas) <b>plus</b> 18 graduate credits in English.
<b>Mathematics</b>	MATH 095	Elementary Algebra (3 credits)	Master of Mathematics or Statistics. Or a bachelor's degree in mathematics and a Master in another discipline.
<b>Mathematics</b>	MATH 096	Intermediate Algebra (3 credits)	Master of Mathematics or Statistics. Or Bachelor of Mathematics and a Master in another discipline.
<b>Mathematics</b>	MATH 120	Fundamentals of College Mathematics (3 credits)	Master of Mathematics or Statistics. Or Bachelor of Mathematics and a Master in another discipline, plus <b>18</b> graduate level credits in Mathematics.

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<b>Mathematics</b>	MATH 126	Precalculus I (3 credits)	Master of Mathematics or Statistics; Or a Bachelor of Mathematics and a Master in another discipline, plus <b>18</b> graduate level credits in Mathematics.
<b>Mathematics</b>	MATH 127	Precalculus II (3 credits)	Master of Mathematics or Statistics; Or a Bachelor of Mathematics and a Master in another discipline, plus <b>18</b> graduate level credits in Mathematics.
<b>Mathematics</b>	MATH 283	Calculus III (4 credits)	Master of Mathematics or Statistics; <b>Or</b> a Bachelor of Mathematics and a Master in another discipline, <b>plus</b> 18 graduate level credits in Mathematics.
<b>Music</b>	MUS 121	Music Appreciation (3 credits)	Master of Music is required. Teaching experience in higher education is helpful- <u>but not required.</u>
<b>Music</b>	MUS 125	History of Rock and Roll (3 credits)	Master of Music is required. Teaching experience in higher education is helpful- <u>but not required.</u>
<b>Political Science</b>	PSC 101	Introduction to American Politics (4 credits)	Master of Political Science OR a Master in another discipline, plus <b>18</b> graduate level credits in Political Science.
<b>Psychology</b>	PSY 101	General Psychology (3 credits)	Master of Psychology with one undergraduate or graduate course in general psychology, statistics, and research methods. <b>OR</b> a bachelor's degree in psychology <b>PLUS</b> a master's degree in a closely related category including licensure in a psychological discipline (e.g. MFT) with one undergraduate or graduate course in general psychology, statistics, and research methods.
<b>Psychology</b>	PSY 102	Psychology of Personal and Social Adjustment (3 credits)	Master of Psychology with one undergraduate or graduate course in general psychology, statistics, and research methods. <b>OR</b> a bachelor's degree in psychology <b>PLUS</b> a master's degree in a closely related category including licensure in a psychological discipline (e.g. MFT) with one undergraduate or graduate course in general psychology, statistics, and research methods.
<b>Sociology</b>	SOC 101	Principles of Sociology (3 credits)	Master of Sociology or a closely related field.
